

SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

John the baptizer was a chosen messenger whose role was to prepare the way for God's entry among his people. He is part of a long line of traditional prophets looking forward to the advent of the Messiah and preparing the people for that historic event. John's message was simple: 'Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight.' His message speaks to us across the ages and urges us to prepare a place for the Lord in our hearts.

John the Baptist began his ministry in the desert by proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. This baptism was a Jewish form of preparation for the coming of the Lord that encouraged people to change their lives for the better and seek forgiveness from God. Advent is an invitation to conversion, and Isaiah in the first reading gives us some down-to-earth advice on improving our lives. Isaiah talks about filling in valleys of prejudice, leveling down mountains of pride, and straightening the crooked paths of injustice. This week, we ask ourselves what in our lives that needs a complete turning around to allow God to come close to us. Are there areas of ourselves that we do not want to be disturbed even though we are aware that they prevent God from entering?

Prayer and penance in Advent time enable us to make a fresh start. Preparing a way for God in our hearts is time-consuming and costly. It demands attentive listening to what God is saying to us. It requires action on our part by making the necessary changes in our behavior. This involves removing all blockages and obstacles that prevent him from coming close. Preparing a way for the Lord may mean walking a new path. Christ cannot save us without our co-operation. He does not force an entry into our lives but waits to be invited.

The voice of John the Baptist also reminds us that we have the important task of announcing Christ to others. Our everyday life is a message telling everyone through acts of kindness, honesty, and faithfulness. We may be the only book about Christ that many people will ever read. John the Baptist invites us to turn this Advent season into real spiritual homecoming by making the necessary preparations for the arrival of the Savior into our lives.

SEGUNDO DOMINGO DE ADVIENTO

Juan el Bautista era un mensajero escogido cuya función era preparar el camino para la entrada de Dios a su pueblo. Es parte de una larga lista de profetas tradicionales que esperan con ansias el advenimiento del Mesías y preparan al pueblo para ese evento histórico. El mensaje de Juan era simple: 'Preparar el camino del Señor, enderezar sus sendas'. Su mensaje nos habla a través de los tiempos y nos insiste a preparar un lugar para el Señor en nuestros corazones.

Juan el Bautista inició su ministerio en el desierto, en el que proclamaba un bautismo de arrepentimiento para el perdón de los pecados. Este bautismo era una forma judía de preparación para la venida del Señor, que animaba a las personas a cambiar sus vidas para mejorar y buscar el perdón de Dios. El Adviento es una invitación a la conversión, e Isaías en la primera lectura nos da algunos consejos prácticos para mejorar nuestras vidas. Isaías habla de llenar los valles de los prejuicios, derribar las montañas del orgullo y enderezar los caminos torcidos de la injusticia. Esta semana, nos preguntamos qué es lo que necesita un cambio completo en nuestras vidas para permitir que Dios se acerque a nosotros. ¿Hay áreas de nosotros mismos que no queremos que se perturben, a pesar de que somos conscientes de que impiden que Dios entre en ellas?

La oración y la penitencia en el tiempo de Adviento nos permiten empezar de nuevo. Preparar un camino para Dios en nuestros corazones requiere mucho tiempo y es costoso. Exige una escucha atenta de lo que Dios nos dice. Requiere acción de nuestra parte haciendo los cambios necesarios en nuestro comportamiento. Esto implica eliminar todos los bloqueos y obstáculos que le impiden acercarse. Preparar un camino para el Señor puede significar caminar por una nueva senda. Cristo no puede salvarnos sin nuestra cooperación. Él no entra a la fuerza en nuestras vidas, sino que espera ser invitado.

La voz de Juan el Bautista también nos recuerda que tenemos la importante tarea de anunciar a Cristo a los demás. Nuestra vida cotidiana es un mensaje que todos transmitimos a través de actos de bondad, honestidad y fidelidad. Puede que seamos el único libro acerca de Cristo que mucha gente leerá alguna vez. Juan el Bautista nos invita a convertir esta temporada de Adviento en un verdadero regreso espiritual al hacer los preparativos necesarios para la llegada del Salvador a nuestra vida.



YOU SPOKE AND WE LISTENED!

Fr. Huy and the Pastoral Council thank all who filled out the Parish Survey. We have taken the last several months to compile the data and make the appropriate adjustments in various stages. The reason for this approach is we understand that not many of us like change, even if the change is beneficial. In this article, we would like to point out some of the changes that resulted directly from your feedback.

LITURGY

- We have introduced the time of 'silence' before Mass to allow parishioners to ready their hearts and minds as they prepare to participate in the Sacred Liturgy.
- We have reinstated the online Mass 7 AM Sunday Mass is streamed each week.
- We have moved announcements to an earlier time to begin Mass on time.
- We have streamlined announcements to reduce duplication with the bulletin.
- We have adjusted the 'pre-Mass' slides to make them accessible to everyone.
- We have adjusted how Mass intentions can be scheduled/requested to accommodate the pastoral needs of our parish.

MINISTRY

- We have invited Santa Catalina ministry leaders to share with you the work they are doing through bulletin articles.
- 35 children attended and 10 youth assisted with Vacation Bible School in June.
- The Pastoral Council has developed a process to welcome new parishioners.
- We are currently working on a new parish website to allow for more timely updates and information on what is happening at the parish.

THINGS WE'RE CURRENTLY WORKING TO IMPROVE

- We are working on improving our sound system and training our lectors so our parishioners are attentive during the Liturgy of the Word.
- We are working to add additional Reconciliation services during the season of Advent and Lent to accommodate the pastoral needs. Please also understand that we only have one priest for most of the sacramental responsibilities at Santa Catalina.
- We have made the necessary changes to streamline the compliance process for our volunteers. Please understand the compliance process is a necessary tool to help protect our parish and the diocese.

There are going to be other changes based on the survey that will take a bit longer to accomplish, so keep an eye out for bulletin articles that will keep you up-to-date on what is happening.

THE LADIES AT SR. JOSE WOMEN'S CENTER NEED YOUR HELP



Sr. Jose has seen the need for services grow at an alarming rate. During 2022, there was a 60% increase in folks who are unsheltered in Pima County. Women make up 37% of the homeless population and 78% of these women are unsheltered. Sr. Jose's has seen a 35% increased demand for services in the past year. In addition, more older women are seeking assistance - 35% of the guests are over 55. The shelters biggest needs are:

- New underwear and socks, ankle and long
- Tennis shoes (new or gently used)
- Backpacks
- Bras and sports bras of all sizes (new or gently used)
- Sleeping bags or light weight yoga mats
- Travel sized items hand sanitizer, body wash, shampoo conditioner, tissues
- Hair ties, brushes, and combs
- Dog and cat food
- Blankets
- Cooler weather clothes
- Deodorant




