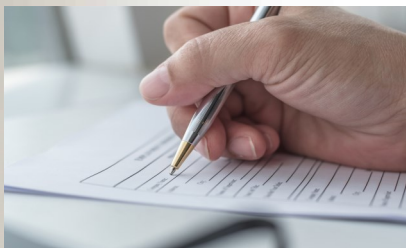


You can help Santa Catalina families who are making real sacrifices to send their children and grandchildren to

Hospitality Minister:



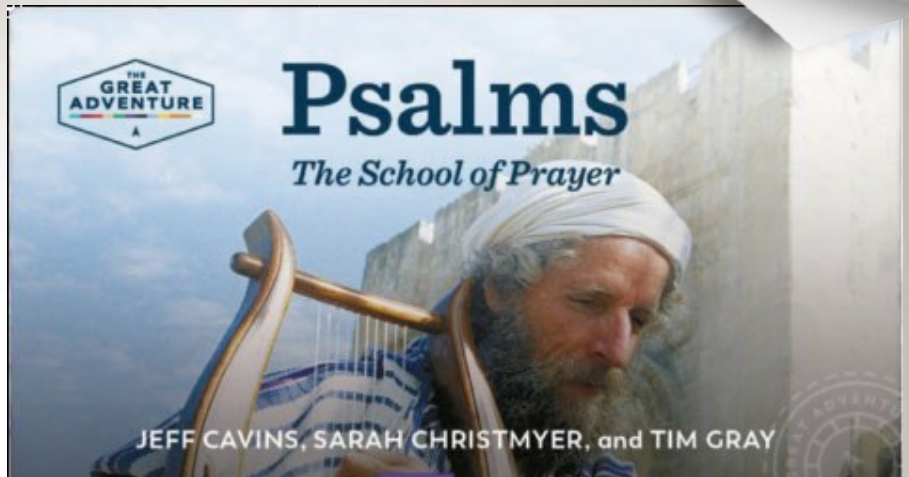

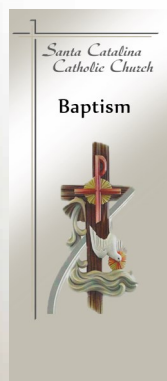
The Bulletin Has a New Look!

This Week's Gospel Reflection

Encourage a Deeper Understanding of the Scripture

A protestant pastor friend of mine was invited to meet Pope Francis with a group of other pastors. He noticed the Pope's chair was especially ornate and set at the head of the group. He somewhat playfully said, "Holy Father, why do you get that special chair?" The group chuckled nervously at my friend's audacious chide.

The following year, the group was invited to return. They entered the room to find only simple chairs placed in a circle. Pope Francis entered, sat down

in one of the humble chairs and, looking directly at my friend, with a twinkle in his eye, asked, "What do you think of my chair now?" My friend was stunned that the Pope remembered his concerns — and took the time to answer them.

Thomas the apostle was certainly stunned by the Risen Jesus displaying his wounds in person. But he also must have been equally shocked that Jesus knew and answered his particular questions, worries, and even demands related to his faith.

How humbled — and perhaps a bit terrified — he must have been to realize God remembers his concerns and cares enough to answer them.

What questions or demands about Jesus do you find in your heart? Like Thomas, will you be bold enough to voice them this week? How wonderful to know that if we do so, God will remember and respond even to our most audacious desires.

¿Sabías qué? el segundo domingo del Tiempo Pascual fue designado "Domingo de la Divina Misericordia" por el Papa Juan Pablo II, en el año 2,000 durante la canonización de santa Faustina Kowalska. El Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica, en su número 1225, ilumina y catequiza lo que el Papa y santa Faustina nos transmitieron al experimentar la misericordia divina en sus vidas. "En su Pascua, Cristo abrió a todos los hombres las fuentes del Bautismo. En efecto, había hablado ya de su pasión que iba a sufrir en

Jerusalén como de un Bautismo con que debía ser bautizado. La sangre y el agua que brotaron del costado traspasado de Jesús crucificado son figuras del Bautismo y de la Eucaristía, sacramentos de la vida nueva: desde entonces, es posible nacer del agua y del Espíritu para entrar en el Reino de Dios". Santa Faustina al pintar el retrato del Señor de la Misericordia nos muestra esta imagen de la misericordia de Cristo Crucificado dada a nosotros por el Bautismo y la Eucaristía.

El Papa Francisco, también, nos

lo explica de la siguiente manera: "La misericordia a la luz de la Pascua se deja percibir como una verdadera forma de conocimiento. Se conoce a través de los sentidos, se conoce a través de la intuición, a través de la razón y aún de otras formas. Bien, se puede conocer también a través de la experiencia de la misericordia, porque la misericordia abre la puerta de la mente para comprender mejor el misterio de Dios y de nuestra experiencia personal (16 de abril del 2023).

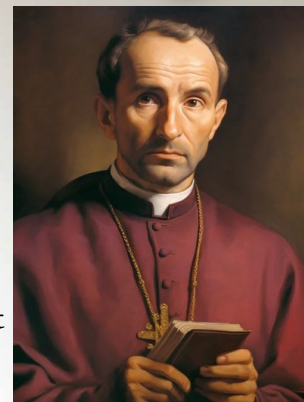


The Redemptorist Brand

You may have, by now, noticed that the logo on our website and (soon to appear on the bulletin) states that Santa Catalina Catholic Church is a *Redemptorist Community*. Even if you knew our Pastor, Fr. Huy, is a member of the Redemptorist society of missionary priests, you may be interested in learning more about what this means.

The Redemptorists' Society was founded in Italy by St Alphonsus Liguori in 1732. According to their rule they are "to strive to imitate the virtues and examples of Jesus Christ, Our Redeemer, consecrating themselves especially to the preaching of the word of God to the poor".

While their target population may have expanded during their nearly 300-year existence, the essence of their teaching remains: to speak to us as Jesus would, that is, in a compelling style that helps us understand how the word of God remains relatable today. You may have already noticed this difference in Fr. Huy's homilies and sermons. We hear in straight forward speech, a relatable interpretation of our Liturgy. This is the *Redemptorist Brand*.



ST. ALPHONSUS LIGUORI

Saint of the Week: St. Oscar Arnulfo Romero y Galdámez

Saint Oscar Arnulfo Romero y Galdámez, born in 1917, was the second of seven children. He was Ordained in April, 1942 in Rome, Italy. He was parish priest of Anamoros, Secretary to the diocese of San Miguel, El Salvador in 1944, Auxiliary Bishop of San Salvador and titular bishop of Tambeae in April, 1970. He was a conservative man and cleric by nature who opposed the repressive El Salvadorian government, putting him at odds with many of the area priests who were aligned with leftist ideologies. He became Bishop of Santiago de Maria, El Salvador in October, 1974 and Archbishop of San Salvador in February, 1977. By this point Romero had come to realize that the ruling class had no concern for the condition of the rest of the population, and was determined to violently repress any opposition. He died from a government-affiliated gunshot in March 1980 in the chapel of La Divina Providencia Hospital while celebrating Mass. He was Canonized in October 2018 by Pope Francis.

These individuals have no other resources to obtain nourishment for their trip. Federal Funding for this project has been cut. A \$1,500 donation was made form the poor box for this program.
