

GOSPEL MEDITAION — DISCOVERING YOUR ISAAC

Everyone has an Isaac; everyone has something, or someone dear and precious, without which or whom life appears devoid of meaning and joy is unattainable. An Isaac can be a life partner whose sharing increases our joys and alleviates our sorrows. An Isaac can be a brother or a sister who knows our thoughts and meets our needs even before we give them a voice. An Isaac can be a child who fills our days with pride and our nights with peace and fulfillment. An Isaac can be a parent or mentor whose eyes we find the love and acceptance we need to grow and in whose example we find the strength and courage to become all we are meant to be. An Isaac can be a friend whose familiar voice never ceases to strike a chord of love within our hearts.

For some, an Isaac might be a treasure that fills the mind with fond memories. For others, their Isaac might be money in the bank and the security of knowing that all their material needs will be provided for. For still others, an Isaac might be a special place that says, "You belong here. Here, you will be safe, secure, and undisturbed." Unfortunately, some among us have made an Isaac of a vice such as gambling or of an abusive behavior such as smoking, drinking, or eating to excess.

What or Who is your Isaac? Is it your privacy? Health? Peace of mind? What is your prestige and reputable status in the community? Is your Isaac comprised of your title or the long litany of academic degrees that follow your name? Is it the record of your successes and accomplishments? Is it the power or authority you wield over others? Whatever each of us might identify as his/her Isaac, the scripture readings for today offer the following challenge. Would you... would I...be willing to follow Abraham's lead, who is featured in the first reading from Genesis, and surrender our Isaac to God?



Fueron testigos de que junto a Jesús estaban Moisés y Elías, que conversaban con él y que eran los portavoces de la ley y los profetas. Para admiración de ellos, de una nube salió una voz que decía: "Este es mi Hijo, el Amado, escúchenlo" (Marcos 9, 7). Escuchar a Dios en la actualidad es difícil, estamos muy distraídos con tantas cosas. Debemos apagar el celular para darnos cuenta de la magnitud del mensaje de hoy.

Es una gracia, un don, el saber escuchar. Será por eso la insistencia de Dios en este domingo de que escuchemos al Amado. Jesús intentaba ayudar a sus discípulos a entender el mensaje de su Pasión, pero, era difícil para ellos. La Transfiguración indica la esperanza de que después de pasar por el Viernes Santo vendrá la resurrección. Hay que pasar por el sufrimiento para merecer la Gloria prometida. ¿Cómo escucho la palabra de Dios? ¿De qué modo la hago mía y la vivo? El Papa Francisco sobre este Domingo nos dice que "La Fiesta de la Transfiguración del Señor nos recuerda que estamos llamados a vivir el encuentro con Cristo, para que iluminados por su luz, podamos llevarla y hacerla brillar en todas partes, como pequeñas lámparas del Evangelio que llevan un poco de amor y de esperanza" (08-06-2021). ¡Escuchemos la voz de los marginados y hagamos algo por ellos!
