FEAST OF THE PRESENTATION OF THE LORD

Friday, February 2 is the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord that is also known as Candlemas Day. Forty days after Jesus' birth Mary and Joseph brought Him to the temple for the rites of purification and dedication as prescribed by the Torah.

Christ is the light who came into this world to dispel sin and darkness. Since the seventh century, candles were blessed on this day that will be used throughout the year. These blessed candles serve as a symbol of Christ, who referred to Himself as "Light of the World." On Candlemas Day, many of the faithful would bring candles to their church, where they are blessed and used for rest of the year in their homes.

At Santa Catalina, parishioners are invited to attend daily Mass on Friday, February 2 and bring your own candles that you would like to

be blessed for their homes. There will be 7-Day candles available for purchase before the 8 AM Mass. The price of a 7-Day candle is \$6.

GOSPEL MEDITATION

We start telling lies around the age of three, the experts tell us. It's understandable. Lying is a godlike power. Whatever I want, I need only say it, and the world rearranges itself accordingly. It's amazing at first. But soon reality snaps back and I'm faced with a dilemma. If I remain committed to my lie I start to fracture into pieces. My words and reality drift apart, and I find myself lost in a lonely world of further falsehoods and fear of being found out.

How marvelous, then, that Jesus begins his ministry by proclaiming: "Repent!" We tend to think it means "stop doing bad things" but it doesn't. It literally means "go beyond the mind you have." Think in a new way. It's painful to admit, but some portion of my mind is addicted to lie-telling, usually to protect my ego or make life easier. To repent means to admit this tendency, to say, "I'm done lying," and to move beyond my split mind into a complete commitment to the truth. Perhaps that's why at Mass we together proclaim, "I have sinned in my thoughts, and in my words..." Repentance and truth-telling work together.

Those who know the twelve-step process of addiction recovery know this process well. The fourth step requires radical truth-telling: listing our moral defects. This isn't being scrupulous. Rather it is freedom from falsehood, and entrance into the real world. This week, I invite you to join me in this practice. Get your phone or piece of paper. Answer the question: what are your true moral defects? Write them down. Remember, the Lord knows them already and loves you. We have a sacrament where this truth-telling is celebrated: Confession. Perhaps it is finally time to go beyond our childish lies.

FIESTA DE LA PRESENTACIÓN DEL SEÑOR

El viernes 2 de febrero es la Fiesta de la Presentación del Señor, también conocida como Día de la Candelaria. Cuarenta días después del nacimiento de Jesús, María y José lo llevaron al templo para los ritos de purificación y dedicación prescritos por la Torá.

Cristo es la luz que vino a este mundo para disipar el pecado y las tinieblas. Desde el siglo VII se bendecían en este día velas que se utilizarán durante todo el año. Estas velas benditas sirven como símbolo de Cristo, quien se refirió a sí mismo como "Luz del mundo". El Día de la Candelaria, muchos de los fieles llevan velas a su iglesia, donde son bendecidas y utilizadas durante el resto del año en sus hogares.

En Santa Catalina, los feligreses están invitados a asistir a Misa diaria el viernes 2 de febrero y traer sus propias velas que le gustaría que sean bendecidas en sus hogares. Habrá velas de 7 días disponibles para su compra antes de la misa de las 8 a.m. El precio de una vela de 7 días es de \$6.

MEDITACIÓN DEL EVANGELIO

Haciendo memoria, a lo largo de la vida, nos daremos cuenta que todos necesitamos arrepentirnos de algo. Sea grande o sea pequeño. También, muchas veces tuvimos que pedir perdón. Hoy, la Palabra de Dios nos dice que los ninivitas se convirtieron de su mala vida: "Los ninivitas creyeron en la advertencia de Dios y ordenaron un ayuno, y se vistieron de saco desde el mayor al menor" (Jonás 3,5). Todo el movimiento de la ciudad y sus habitantes se desencadena con la Palabra de Dios, que invita al arrepentimiento antes de ser destruida. Cuando el mal es mucho, se necesitan profetas y misioneros que evangelicen. La misión es inmensa.

La conversión consiste en abandonar el mal, las malas costumbres, las obras que llevan al pecado y dañan a los demás. ¿Crees tú que necesitemos algo así en nuestra sociedad actual? ¿Qué actitudes se necesitan para llegar a una verdadera conversión personal, familiar y comunitaria? Definitivamente, una de ellas es la decisión al cambio, seguida por la esperanza de que este sucederá. Jesús tiene esa esperanza e inicia el proceso de conversión de arrepentimiento llamando a sus primeros colaboradores e invitándolos a la conversión, es decir a que cambien su modo de vivir y de proceder: "El tiempo se ha cumplido, el Reino de Dios está cerca. Renuncien a su mal camino y crean en la Buena Nuevas" (Marcos 1,15). Renunciar al mal camino y creer que lo lograremos, ¡es el reto de este Evangelio! Oremos para que llegue la conversión a nuestro corazón. ©LPi





(PRACTICING)

A Good Time for Fulfillment

There are some things that always come at the worst time. I've never gotten a telemarketing call and thought, "This is a really convenient moment for me to listen to a sales pitch." I've never seen the compulsory software update notice flash on my computer screen when I *didn't* have a deadline I was struggling to meet. My kids never come down with the flu unless it's the weekend and the line at Urgent Care is stretching out the door.

And I never, ever feel the calm, persistent shouldertap of the Holy Spirit without thinking, "Now? Now is not a good time. Can you try again when I'm..."

But then I stop and think: when I am what? When I am stronger? When I am happier? When I am smarter? When I am a different person?

When God calls us, He calls the person He sees in front of Him. "Come on," He says, and He doesn't mean "When you're finished" or "When it's convenient" or "Think about it." He means now. This moment.

This is what Paul is saying when he writes that "the world in its present form is passing away." He is saying that your plans mean nothing, the kingdom of God is at hand. Abandon your nets, let your catch escape into the sea. You're not who you thought you were, and you don't need what you thought you needed.

Your sins do not define you. Your fears are not fate. Your inclinations do not govern you. Your life can be changed. We live in the time of fulfillment, and fulfillment is coming for you — ready or not.

Question:

Ministries of outreach and support, such as Project Rachel, offer pastoral counseling, support groups, retreats, and other forms of care. As Christians, we are also called to help promote this healing and reconciliation in all its forms.

HAPPENINGS AT SANTA CATALINA

SISTER CAROLE RULAND MEMORIAL MASS

Sister Carole Ruland, MHSH went home to God on January 4, 2024. Sister Carole was 83 years old and had been a member of the Mission Helper of the Sacred Heart for 64 years. She was the Pastoral Administrator at Santa Catalina Church from 1988-2008. Under her administration the small mission of Santa Catalina flourished. The mission had no priest and only 180 families. When she left in 2008 it had become a parish with 1250 families and had a new church building. Sister Carole held a special place in her heart for the people of Santa Catalina and she will be missed by many. Sister Carole's memorial mass will be held on Tuesday, January 30 at 11 AM followed by a reception.

Sr. Carole was a very welcoming administrator to new members of the parish – always friendly with a smile. She involved members in many activities, especially supporting those in need. One example was involving over 70 parishioners to support the boys on a weekly basis at the boy's detention center in Catalina.

TRAVELING VOCATIONS CROSS PROGRAM

The Traveling Vocations Cross program is an organized weekly activity, in a portable kit, to pray for vocations to the priesthood, religious life, marriage, and consecrated single life. The Catholic church recognizes these as the principal spiritual vocations in life. We highly encourage those parishioners who attend either the 9:00am or the 5:00pm Mass, where the program is currently offered, to participate.



After a parishioner signs up to take home the Traveling Vocations Cross, they take the cross out of the kit, assemble it, and place it in a prominent space in the home. Each day, Monday through Friday, you say the prayers included with the kit.

There is no obligation other than to pray once daily for vocations at the Cross, and then to return the kit the following week for the next participant to take it home.

The presiding priest calls each week's participant to the altar at the end of Mass to receive the Traveling Vocations Cross kit.

If you have further questions, you may ask a member of the Vocations Ministry who will be outside of church after Mass.

MINISTRY NEWS

POOR BOX

Every quarter, the Social Awareness and Justice Ministry (SAJM) recommends local organizations that serve the poor to receive \$500 each from the "Poor Box" funds. Fr. Huy approves the recipients. Thank you for your generous donations. Our most recent recipients are:



AGUILAS DEL DESIERTO

Aguilas del Desierto's mission is to help families whose loved ones are missing in the desert areas near our border. Its goal is to respond immediately to every call for help. At times, they rescue crossers in distress, at times they search for the remains of a loved one whose life was claimed by the desert. Since 1996, over 7,000 migrants have died in the deserts along our border. Every day Aguilas receives multiple calls from families desperate for help. Since Aguilas began in 2012, they have rescued 92 people and recovered the remains of 92 people.

SR. JOSE WOMEN'S CENTER

Every night volunteers from various organizations bring food to prepare to feed the roughly 45 women who spend the night at Sr. Jose Women's Center. These women are working with case managers to try to finish their education and build a live for themselves to help them out of homelessness. The Sr. Jose Ministry volunteers are going to prepare a meal each month on a rotating basis. The money from the poor box will pay for the food that is served.





