#### GOSPEL MEDITATION

A stranger in a foreign land, I was exhausted and homesick as my summer Spanish immersion ended in Guatemala. The rusty minivan arriving outside my small residence filled me with joyful hope. I was flying home to the U.S. and would be, at long last, completely happy. Or so I thought. After about half an hour of being home, I thought to myself, "This place is boring. I want to go somewhere." So, I hopped in my car and left to see my friends. As I drove, I wistfully wondered, "Where am I truly at home?"

The feast of Epiphany has a lot to do with our notion of home. Where is our origin? Where are we going? When is our wandering done? Saint Matthew tells us of the Magi, "They were overjoyed at seeing the star." This star will bring them home, to a place where their questing will end, and they will be satisfied. Their real home is neither in the East nor in the earthly Jerusalem. Somehow, their home is wherever this boy and his parents are.

If you're a teenager or older, you probably know by now that every physical home we have is temporary. So, we look up at the countless stars in our proverbial skies: things which bedazzle and beckon us to follow toward peace. The Gospel invites us to behold that — at long last — God has sent us a star to follow home, one that whispers, "Follow me! I will take you home!" Perhaps that star is your spouse. A friend. An opportunity. A cause. An intuition about a new direction. A prayer group. What is it for you? How will you know? It will lead you to Mary and Joseph and their son, and you will be home.

#### Step Into the Light

How strange it is to think that if not for Herod's directions, the magi would not have known where to find Jesus. They were not Jews, they knew nothing of the old prophecies. It was Herod who convened the scholars. It was Herod who pointed the way — for ulterior motives, certainly, but nonetheless, this is the part he played. It was Herod who made the Epiphany possible.

"Nations shall walk by your light, and kings by your shining radiance," writes the prophet (Isaiah 60:3). A king may keep to the shadows, suspicious of the light — he may foolishly imagine he can snatch it from the sky to keep as his own possession, and, upon finding the light cannot be governed, grow to loathe it, and even seek to extinguish it once and for all.

But all his grand designs will come to nothing because there is no king so powerful that he can see in the dark. And even a man like Herod — a man so jealous that he sought to kill God — cannot prevent the breaking of day.

The Epiphany marks the manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles. It is a celebration of truth reaching places it was not expected to reach, of brightness illuminating corners of the world long ago consigned to shadow. It is a reminder that the battle has already been won, the night is over. All that remains is for us to decide: will we step into the light?

"See, darkness covers the earth, and thick clouds cover the peoples; but upon you the LORD shines, and over you appears his glory." — Isaiah 60:2

# Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

#### Question:

How are the feasts of the baptism of Jesus and the account of the wedding feast of Cana related to the Epiphany celebration?

#### Answer:

The Epiphany season focuses on revealing Jesus to the world. Following the Christmas celebration, the liturgical year lays out a series of manifestation points in which Jesus is made publicly known. From its very beginning, the Christian community highlighted three events in the life of Jesus. These are the Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord and the wedding feast at Cana.

The Epiphany discloses Jesus to the world of the Gentiles, represented by the magi from the East. The accounts of Jesus' baptism reveal his identity and mission, along with exposing him to those to whom he was sent to minister. The miracle of turning water to wine at the wedding feast of Cana, unique to John's Gospel, is the first public sign that Jesus performs, thus manifesting his public identity and his powers.

Today in the Roman Church, these are usually celebrated on three successive Sundays: Epiphany, the Baptism of the Lord which is usually the next Sunday, and the wedding feast of Cana, which is proclaimed on the 2nd Sunday of Ordinary Time in lectionary year C.

These feasts connect around the concept of epiphany, public manifestation of Jesus to the world. They help us get to know more intimately who Jesus is and what he is about. Spend some time delving more deeply into your understanding of who Jesus is. Continue to cultivate these "epiphany" moments in your life.

#### 2024 MARCH FOR LIFE DETAILS

On Saturday, January 20, 2024, the Dioceses of Tucson will hold the 34th Tucson March for Life. It will begin at 9 AM with a Mass in the St. Augustine Cathedral celebrated by Bishop Weisenburger. The March will start at approximately 10:15 AM from the Cathedral



to Holy Hope Cemetery (On Oracle just North of E Fort Lowell). The March covers about 3.8 miles and takes about 1 hour and 15 minutes.

At the cemetery, there is a brief presentation by the Bishop which is followed by a rose ceremony where a March participant, who was born in each year that Roe v Wade was in force (1973-2022), places a rose at the Shrine of the Innocents. You can attend any or all activities.

#### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

**Q:** Why are we still marching since Roe was overturned?

**A.** Abortions were allowed throughout the US with Roe in force. Once it was overturned, the states are making the decisions whether to allow or ban abortions. Approximately half of the states have allowed abortions, which includes Arizona. The movement to abolish abortions in all 50 states has just begun. Be a part of that movement.

Q: What if I start the March but can't continue?

**A.** There are a number of "rescue" cars at the end of the procession that will take you to the cemetery.

**Q:** If I march from the Cathedral to the Cemetery do I have to walk back to my car at the church?

**A.** At the end of the Cemetery activity, participants with cars at the cemetery will transport you back to the church.

**Q:** Is it dangerous to march on the streets to Holy Hope?

A. The complete route is protected by traffic cones which marchers must not cross and the route is patrolled by about 5 Tucson police officers on motorcycles. They ensure that the march is non-confrontational and peaceful.

# WHY IS MY LOVED ONE WITH MENTAL ILLNESS NOT GETTING BETTER?



The Mental Health Ministry is hosting an expert panel discussion called "Understanding the Levels of Psychiatric Care is Key to Treatment Success." There will be a



presenter on the following levels of care - inpatient, residential, hospitalization, and outpatient. The people with the most information about the patient, the family, do not always know or understand the different levels of care available to help their loved one. Therefore, their experience is one of helplessness and hopelessness. We will explore the different levels of psychiatric care available that may help families navigating these difficult situations. We hope those attending this panel discussion will gain understanding of the different levels of mental health care.

The discussion will be held on January 21 from 1-3 PM OR January 29 from 6-8 PM. The same program will be repeated twice, so feel free to attend the one that fits your schedule.

#### REMINDER - CASA ALITAS UNDERWEAR AND SOCK DRIVE - AT ALL

#### MASSES ON JANUARY 27 AND 28



Casa Alitas is a humanitarian aid project committed to providing assistance to asylumseekers. Currently, Casa Alitas is providing support for around 500 - 700 individuals a day. Most people who come to Casa Alitas have been traveling or detained for weeks. Clean underwear and socks are the biggest need for the families with children and pregnant women that arrive daily. Casa Alitas is in desperate need of the following:

#### **NEW Underwear:**

- Children's sizes. T (2-3), 4, 6, 8, 10, 12


