

REFLECTING ON THE READINGS

Father's Ponderings

The readings for this week invite us to examine our conscience about the sincerity of our words and our lives. The text invites us to let go of all hypocrisy and respect the truth about ourselves. The prophet Malachi, in the first reading, condemns the irresponsible, proud, lazy priests of his day. St. Paul, in the second reading, presents himself as an ideal example of servant leadership in caring for his Christian community. In the Gospel, Jesus offers a word of judgment against the religious leaders of his day who have been more concerned with self-promotion than giving service to others.

Jesus was harsh in his criticism of these religious leaders because they failed to practice what they preached. He pointed them out as pious frauds who were good at pretending and loved to be the center of attention. Their long prayers were simply an outward show because they neglected the important matters of faith, justice, and mercy. Instead, they were empty and hollow, neither good nor holy. Their way of life pointed to a display of vanity and self-importance. As a result, their preaching led people astray. Jesus saw through their pretense and accused them of hypocrisy. It would be wrong for us to poke fun at the unflattering picture of these spiritual leaders painted in the gospel.

Jesus' message is essential for our time. There is plenty of food for thought for everyone because we are all tainted with hypocrisy. Very few can truthfully say that our deeds always match our words. We may not be as hypocritical as the Pharisees. Still, we can quickly put on a show to hide our shortcomings and appear virtuous. Most of us are good at presenting one face to the public and displaying a different one for our family and friends. Appearances do not fool Jesus because he could see into the depths of our hearts. Jesus wants his followers to avoid the obvious mistakes of the Pharisees, which emptied God's word of its power and content.

To live up to what we profess as followers of Christ, we must mean what we say and do what we mean. Jesus invites all, especially the more pious and those who tend to be judgmental of others, to examine behind our good works. Do we perform good works for the glory of God or to seek our advancement? Our words will fall on deaf ears when our behavior is irresponsible. As actions speak louder than words, we must match our external behavior with an inner genuineness. In all circumstances of life, we lead by example, and that is what will bring others to Christ.





PRO-LIFE BABY SHOWER


