




Join more than 80,000 Catholics who will be attending the National Eucharistic Congress, July 18-21, 2024, in Indianapolis, Indiana

May is Dedicated to Mary

It is a centuries-old custom of Catholics to dedicate the month of May to the Blessed Virgin Mary. May is always part of the Easter season, the fifty days we celebrate in the liturgy the

Resurrection of Our Lord, a time of awaiting the outpouring of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

At the Visitation, Elizabeth said to Mary: "Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled". Our Lady is blessed not only because she was the Mother of Jesus, but because she believed in the Lord's words. She believed with all her heart and said "yes" to become the Mother of the Messiah and Son of God. She allowed herself to be led by God's grace throughout her life, rooted in a deep faith in God. She became her Son's first and most perfect disciple.

We hope to walk always with Mary at our side. She is our model of faith and she helps us with her prayers to live by faith. She teaches us to believe as she believed. Many churches and schools have celebrations of the crowning of images of Our Lady. This is a beautiful custom that expresses our love for the Mother of God as our Queen. Other Marian devotions are

particularly fitting in the month of May. Of course, the holy rosary is always a

wonderful prayer to enter more deeply into the mysteries of Christ's life with Mary. It is a Gospel Prayer.

All honor that we give to Mary is ordered to, and leads to, the adoration of God. Devotion to Mary fosters within us a faithful adherence to her Son. When we crown images of Mary, we are honoring her. In honoring Mary, we are ultimately praising God for the grace He bestowed

on her. We all have our favorite images of Mary as well as our favorite devotions. They help us to know the virtues of Mary and remind us to turn to her for help.

May the Blessed Virgin Mary intercede for us and draw us closer to Christ her Son.

This Week's Gospel Reflection

A few months ago, I had the singular privilege of a private meeting with Pope Francis. We were a small group of pastors, composed largely of non-Catholics. The Holy Father wished to discuss our work for Christian unity. The phrase I remember him saying with greatest frequency was: Tutti dentro. It means, "Everyone in." He clearly wanted us to emphasize that the Church is made for the whole human race, not a select few. At the center of his concern was unity. We are all brothers and sisters, he said multiple times. The Church's primary longing is for everyone

This longing is at the heart of this Ascension feast day. We hear the longest recorded prayer of the one whom Pope Francis

to join Her.

represents. Jesus' concern is unity, praying to the Father, "that they may be one, even as we are one" (John 17:11). The deep unity of all people in Christ through the power of the Holy Spirit is what Jesus most desires. It is what he ascends to accomplish.

Do we have this same burning desire in our hearts, too? Or do we see Christian unity as an unrealizable dream? Or worse, as something that threatens our own narrow tribal interests? This feast is a wonderful time to consider our attitude

toward Christian unity, and to commit to do whatever we can to foster it. It is the Pope's desire because it is that of Jesus — and it should be ours, too.

Those words from Psalm 130 are the motto of the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer (the Redemptorists). Saint Alphonsus Liguori, the founder of the Redemptorist, chose those words to guide the Congregation because they expressed his most profound experience of God: God loves us lavishly and extravagantly. God's love is manifested most amazingly in the Incarnation of Jesus Christ, who gave himself entirely for God and for humanity—a self-gift that reached its highest point in his death on the cross.

In recent years, Redemptorists have come to a renewed and deeper understanding of the Church as the communion of believers entrusted with carrying on the redeeming mission of Jesus. The Church is the people of God, embracing all the baptized and inviting all to share in its evangelizing mission. So, Redemptorists have been seeking ways to involve others—laypeople especially—in their part of the mission of Jesus and the Church.

In North America, the desire has grown among the faithful to share in Redemptorists' spirituality and mission. The Redemptorist North American Commission for Partnership in Mission has fostered and nourished that desire in this Spirituality Series. We hope the series will deepen your understanding of Redemptorist's spirituality and, more importantly, deepen their Christian spirituality and communion with God.

Isaiah 61



Our pastoral compassion is directed towards the most abandoned as we strive to evangelize them while being evangelized by them.

According to the Hebrew Scriptures, the nearest blood relative or the redeemer is responsible for making things right. Jesus, the Redeemer, is at the core of all our prayers. The Eucharist is particularly precious to us as it renews and makes present the saving death and resurrection of Jesus Christ. As a communal celebration, it highlights the importance of community in Redemptorist apostolic life. We hold Mary, the Mother of God, in high esteem, particularly under the title of Our Mother of Perpetual Help, following the example of St. Alphonsus. All of this fills us with the desire to give our lives for plentiful redemption.

The quilts will then be picked up by the Project Linus Tucson Chapter, who will distribute them to 33 different recipient locations in the Tucson area. Know Before You Recycle

The *Caring for God's Creation Ministry* would like to remind you:

No food, No liquids, No straws, *No* plastic cups or plastic dishware in the recycling bin.

Never put your recyclables in plastic bags and never put any plastic bags in your recycling bin. Plastic bags and wrap get jammed in recycling processing equipment, which causes recycling to be expensive to process.

Do Not put cheesy, oily pizza boxes in your recycling

bin. Clean pizza boxes are fine.

No need to wash, however, please empty and scrape out the food or materials from all bottles, jars, containers, and cans before putting them in the recycling bin. No flexible packaging like chip For instance, if you have a peanut butter jar, just scrape it as clean as possible, but no need to wash it. Labels are ok, but please remove all metal lids from glass jars and recycle plastic containers with the lid on.

Do recycle clean paper and all clean and flattened cardboard boxes. If you have time, please
