

# UPDATE FROM FATHER HUY VU

I intend to connect more deeply with Santa Catalina parishioners and be better at communicating with you all regularly through our parish bulletin. In this letter, I wish to give you an update on the happenings in Santa Catalina in the last few months.

**Update on staff:** I would like to take this opportunity to congratulate Donna Opsatnick who has completed the probationary period. Santa Catalina is delighted and blessed to have Donna as a member of our staff. If you need to schedule Mass Intentions, Anointing, Communion, Pastoral visitation, meeting with a priest, or just to let Donna know that she is an AWESOME Receptionist please do not hesitate to call us at 520-825-9611.

Bishop Edward J. Weisenburger with the recommendation of my Provincial Superior, Reverend Kevin Zubel, C.Ss.R has appointed me as Pastor of Santa Catalina. My official appointment started on July 1, 2023. I cannot express how appreciative I am for the kindness and love I received after my announcement. I am grateful for the support from the staff and the incredible volunteers that helped me through my tenure as Administrator last year. With your support, I hope to continue the good ministry and fidelity to Christ in service of His Church. With your help and prayers, I look forward to serving Santa Catalina in the next four years with the same enthusiasm, commitment, and joy as I feel today as your Pastor.

**Update on my recent trip**: At the beginning of August, I took a trip to Carthage, MO to attend the 44th annual Marian Festival. The celebration is a festival and a pilgrimage for Vietnamese American Roman Catholics celebrated since 1978 on a 28-acre campus of the Congregation of the Mother of the Redeemer (CMR). The celebration is held on the first Thursday in August each year in honor of the Virgin Mary and lasts for four days. This year the festival drew close to 50,000 in attendance. Despite the impressive turnout, attendance is still thousands less than in the pre-Covid years, which numbered more than 70,000.

Located in the Midwest makes Carthage, MO an ideal location for pilgrims from the East Coast and the West Coast. Marian Festival offers opportunities for individuals, family, and friends to come together for a celebration, enhancing relationships with God through reconciliation, prayers, and Eucharist. During the week, I got to hang out with my mom, friends, and families that I have met during my time in formation. They came from Houston, San Antonio, Kansas City, Minneapolis, Austin, California, and Chicago. I also attended several talks that helped answer questions about the Feast of the Assumption of Mary. The highlight of the festival was the rosary procession. There were so many participants the procession stretched over a mile long.

At the end of the week, I returned to Tucson feeling energized, refreshed, and affirmed in the vocation I have chosen. I look forward to attending the next Marian Festival in 2024.

**Update on Annual Catholic Appeal:** The goal for Santa Catalina parish is \$140,000. Thanks to your generous support we have raised 81% of this amount. **We only need \$26,500 to complete our commitment.** We are inviting parishioners that have yet to make your pledge to participate in this endeavor. With your support, the Catholic Foundation will be able to provide financial resources to the ministries and charities that serve individuals and families of our parishes, schools, and communities across the Tucson Diocese.

Actualización sobre el personal: Me gustaría aprovechar esta oportunidad para felicitar a Donna Opsatnick que ha completado el período de prueba. Nuestra Parroquia de Santa Catalina está encantada y bendecida de tener a Donna como miembro de nuestro personal. Si necesita programar intenciones de misa, unción, comunión, visitas pastorales, reunión con un sacerdote, o simplemente hacerle saber a Donna es que es una recepcionista IMPRESIONANTE, no dude en llamarnos al 520-825-9611.

El Obispo Edward J. Weisenburger con la recomendación de mi Superior Provincial, el Reverendo Kevin Zubel, C.Ss.R me ha nombrado Párroco de Santa Catalina. Mi nombramiento oficial comenzó el 1 de julio de 2023. No puedo expresar lo agradecido que estoy por la amabilidad y el amor que recibí después de mi anuncio. Estoy agradecido por el apoyo del personal y los increíbles voluntarios que me ayudaron durante mi mandato como Administrador el año pasado. Con su apoyo, espero continuar el buen ministerio y la fidelidad a Cristo al servicio de su Iglesia. Con su ayuda y sus oraciones, espero servir a Santa Catalina en los próximos cuatro años con el mismo entusiasmo, compromiso y alegría que siento hoy como su Pastor.

Actualización sobre mi reciente viaje: A principios de agosto, hice un viaje a Carthage, MO para asistir al 44° Festival Mariano que se realiza anualmente. La celebración consiste en un festival y una peregrinación para los católicos romanos vietnamitas estadounidenses que se celebra desde 1978 en un campus de 28 acres de la Congregación de la Madre del Redentor (CMR). La celebración se realiza el primer jueves de agosto de cada año en honor a la Virgen María y dura cuatro días. Este año, el festival atrajo a cerca de 50,000 asistentes. A pesar de la impresionante participación, la asistencia sigue siendo miles menos que en los años anteriores a Covid, en los cuales llegaron a sumar más de 70,000 asistentes.

La ubicación en el Medio Oeste hace de Carthage, MO un lugar ideal para peregrinos de la costa este y la costa oeste. El Festival Mariano ofrece oportunidades para que individuos, familias y amigos se reúnan para una celebración, mejorando las relaciones con Dios a través de la reconciliación, las oraciones y la Eucaristía. Durante la semana, pude pasar el rato con mi madre, amigos y familias que he conocido durante mi tiempo en formación. Venían de Houston, San Antonio, Kansas City, Minneapolis, Austin, California y Chicago. También asistí a varias charlas que ayudaron a responder preguntas sobre la Fiesta de la Asunción de María. El punto culminante del festival fue la procesión del rosario. Había tantos participantes que la procesión se extendía más de una milla de largo.

Al final de la semana, regresé a Tucson sintiéndome energizado, renovado y reafirmado en la vocación que he elegido. Espero asistir al próximo Festival Mariano en 2024.

Actualización sobre la Campaña Católica Anual: La meta para la parroquia de Santa Catalina es de \$140,000. Gracias a su generoso apoyo hemos recaudado el 81% de esta cantidad. Solo necesitamos \$26,500 para completar nuestro objetivo. Estamos invitando a los feligreses que aún no han hecho su promesa a participar en este esfuerzo. Con su apoyo, la Fundación Católica podrá proporcionar recursos financieros a los ministerios y organizaciones benéficas que sirven a individuos y familias de nuestras parroquias, escuelas y comunidades en toda la Diócesis de Tucson.


Training sessions for volunteers interested in becoming EMHCs and

is like to live with mental illness. Audiences are given a safe place to ask questions and gain understanding of an often misunderstood topic. Through dialogue, we begin to understand mental illness and the journey to recovery. In addition to the video presentation, there will be guest speakers, resource information, and opportunities for Q & A.

# SEPTEMBER IS NATIONAL SUICIDE PREVENTION AWARENESS MONTH

September is a time to raise awareness of the stigmatized, and often taboo, topic of suicide. It is important to shift public perception, spread hope and share vital information to people affected by suicide. The goal is to ensure individuals, friends and families have access to the resources they need to discuss suicide prevention and to seek help.

Suicide is the 2nd leading cause of death among people aged 10–14, the 3rd leading cause of death among people aged 15-24 and the 12th leading cause of death in the U.S.

Suicidal thoughts, much like mental health conditions, can affect anyone regardless of age, gender or background. In fact, suicide is often the result of an untreated mental health condition. Suicidal thoughts, although common, should not be considered normal and often indicate more serious issues.

Throughout the month of September, the National Alliance on Mental Illness (NAMI) will highlight the "Together for Mental Health," campaign which encourages people to bring their voices together to advocate for better mental health care, including an effective crisis response system.

After years of advocacy and preparation, 988 is now available nationwide as the new number to contact for mental health, substance use and suicide crises — a simple, easy-to-remember way for people to get help. This new number allows people to quickly connect with support during a crisis, 24/7, no matter where they live. Since it went live on July 16, 2022, the call centers have received over 23 million calls.
