

# **The Vineyard**

The second son never showed up to the vineyard. Did he get lost? Did he get tired? Did he not know where to begin?

When it comes right down to it, good intentions amount to very little. We all know this, don't we? "Show me, don't tell me." "I'll believe it when I see it." It's as true in the workplace and in relationships as it is in the life of the Christian disciple.

It doesn't matter if we *intend* to work in the vineyard. It doesn't matter if we promise to, if we think about it a lot, or if we make grand plans for what we will accomplish there. None of that matters if we don't show up. Before we show up, we have to find the way.

Showing up is the whole point. The work is the point, not the intention.

But all this begs the question: what does the *work* mean for us as baptized Catholics in the modern world? Spending our Saturdays in soup kitchens and homeless shelters? Standing on a street corner shouting out the words of the Gospel?

Our baptismal call is to the vineyard. Where is our vineyard? How do we show up? *We are ready, Lord, we say. We intend to work. But where do we go?* 

My vineyard is not your vineyard, and so it's not my place to tell you how to get there. I am glad you want to go, but you'll have to find your own way, just like I will. But I can tell you this: only one voice will lead you there. If you listen to it, you will find your vineyard.

# Why do we do that? Catholic Life Explained

# **Question:**

Can anyone offer the Anointing of the Sick to a sick or dying person, or is that only something a priest can do?

#### Answer:

The Letter of James speaks to us of the ancient tradition of a special anointing and blessing of those who are sick: "Is there anyone sick among you? Let him send for the presbyters of the Church and let them pray over him, anointing him with oil in the name of the Lord ... If he has committed any sins, they will be forgiven him" (5:14, 15b). This passage forms the foundation for the theology of the sacrament that we call "Anointing of the Sick." In keeping with what we read in the Letter of James and the ancient tradition of the Church, the anointing of a person of who sick or dying many only be performed by a priest or bishop.

Although deacons and other members of the Church are not able to celebrate the sacrament with a person who is sick, we can read Sacred Scripture and pray with and for those who are ill. Resources like the Book of Blessings also contain special blessings that can be celebrated by deacons or lay ministers. In the end, we want to be sure that we show a special care and concern for the sick, helping them to always experience God's loving comfort through made tangible through our acts of charity and service.


Training sessions for volunteers interested in becoming EMHCs and

# COLLECTION FOR KIDS AT CASA ALITAS ON OCTOBER 7 AND 8

The children that come to Casa Alitas have had to leave their homes, travel for days or weeks and are in a strange new country. Most of the time, they have nothing they can call their own. They have to wait for hours while their parents meet with people and fill out papers. In addition, many of them have to go to school in a strange place.

Santa Catalina's Casa Alitas Ministry plans to assemble "activity kits" and provide them to each child. The kits will provide age appropriate toys to entertain the children and would also

include school supplies for school age children.

On the weekend of October 7th-8th, the Casa Altas Ministry is sponsoring a drive to collect items for these kits to help the children prepare for school and have something they can call their own. The children are grouped by age (1-4), (5-11), and (12-18). Items needed:

- Socks
- Backpacks
- Small stuffed animals (i.e. Beanie Babies)

- 1. 40 days of fasting and prayer for an end to abortion;
- 2. 40 days of peaceful vigil;
- 3. 40 days of community service.

By participating in this Pro-Life work, with prayer at the center of our efforts, we send a powerful message to the community about the tragic reality of the prevalent anti-life movement in our culture.

Worldwide, the results of 40 Days For Life document the facts that thousands of lives are saved, abortion centers are closed, and abortion workers resign. 40 Days For Life has no denominational affiliation. Persons of all faiths are invited and the response from huge numbers of churches and outreach organizations continues to be so positive since the inception of this program in 2004.
