The conventional wisdom of fitness experts and health professionals is that we should drink eight glasses of water a day. This suggestion is the product of a country with the luxury of clean, abundant, easily accessible water. Some of us are so used to processed water that we balk when we have to drink well water.

Some people think bottled water is a necessity because, in their minds, it tastes better. It rarely hits home that in much of the world safe drinking water is scarce, if available at all. People who live in those areas have to make do with the little good water they have for drinking, cooking, and washing.

In the desert regions of the Middle East, wells were a source of life and a social meeting place. Asking for water took a little courage in a place where water was rare. Offering someone water was a great gesture of hospitality.

Jesus' request invited the woman's hospitality and led to so much more. She opened her life to Jesus; in turn, Jesus revealed who he was and the gift of life he brings.

Living water must have sounded like a dream to a woman with a stagnant well, and maybe it does to us as well, but we do know this: Those who drink eight glasses of water a day will eventually die as surely as those who fight for even one.

On the other hand, Jesus promises that if we drink the water he gives, we will have eternal life—for he is Living Water itself.

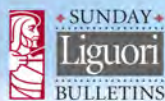

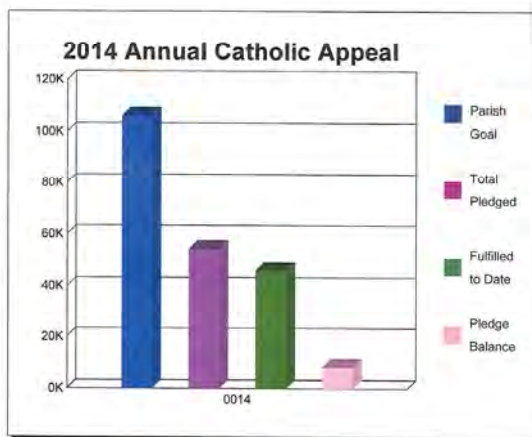

### CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES COLLECTION on March 29-30

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The Catholic Relief Services Collection funds six Catholic agencies that work to serve our suffering brothers and sisters around the world. Through humanitarian aid, resettling displaced individuals and families, and advocating on behalf of victims, the Catholic Relief Services Collection allows us to see every encounter with a suffering person as an opportunity to **help Jesus in disguise**.

During drought seasons, the only water available in Ethiopia and other areas of East Africa runs deep underground, often as deep as 1,000 feet. **Catholic Relief Services (CRS)** worked with other aid partners to bring in rigs that can drill down to these depths. These water sources make a tremendous difference in the community. Livestock stay healthier and produce more milk, which means that the people have more food and rely less on outside resources. However, more work remains to be done. Many of the wells serve double the population they were made for, and program managers fear that the communities will be unable to continue their pastoral work if more wells are not added.

In 2013, Religious Immigration Services (RIS), a department of **Catholic Legal Immigration Network, Inc. (CLINIC)** which assists Catholic religious workers with visas, helped a priest from Kenya enter the United States on a religious worker visa, so that he could serve as a chaplain for the Little Sisters of the Poor and St. Anne's Home in San Francisco. The home gives elderly people of limited financial means a place to live with dignity. Since its foundation in 1901, the home has welcomed more than 20,000 elderly men and women of all faiths, nationalities, and backgrounds. Thanks to the CRS Collection, they now have a chaplain.

CLINIC and CRS are two of six worldwide Catholic relief agencies funded by the Catholic Relief Services Collection. These agencies work to provide food, water, disaster relief, and other vital assistance to Jesus in the disguise of suffering people each day.

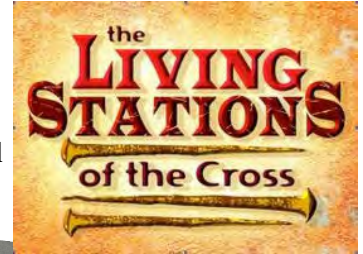

## LIFE TEEN GOSPEL REFLECTION - (MATTHEW 4:1-11)

In this Gospel the role of the Samaritan woman is just like the role we play in everyday life. Jesus approaches her, and she does not recognize him as the Messiah. Jesus asks her for a drink of water. He goes on to say that He (Jesus) has the water that will never make her thirst again. The water is the knowledge and love of God. Jesus uses this parable to show us that He is always there to fulfill our thirst. We as humans can't last very long without water. I know that it is also hard to last without the living water. Drinking that water gives me the knowledge and power to worship Jesus Christ and the Father just as it gave the Samaritan woman the power to tell her people that the Messiah has come. I felt that once I drank the water from Jesus I no longer find myself wondering if He is truly present in my life.

**#3—RIGHTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES**

“Every person has a fundamental right to life,” say the U.S. Bishops, “the right that makes all other rights possible. Each person also has a right to the conditions for living a decent life—faith and family life, food and shelter, education and employment, health care and housing. We also have a duty to secure and respect these rights not only for ourselves, but for others, and to fulfil our responsibilities to our families, to each other, and to the larger society.” (Faithful Citizenship: A Catholic Call to Political Responsibility, 2003.)

Rights and responsibilities are inextricably tied: “The obligation to earn one’s bread presumes the right to do so.” (The Hundredth Year, Centesimus Annus, John Paul II, 1991)

Emphasizing rights and neglecting responsibility leads to contradictions and threats to the common good. Much of the discussion in politics today is focused on individual rights, and neglects the corresponding responsibilities including our corporate responsibility to each other and future generations.

**RIGHTS**

Human rights can be, and often are, interpreted very broadly and are sometimes confused with desires or wants. In Catholic social teaching, the rights related to the basic necessities of living a dignified life take center stage.

In his Address to the 34th General Assembly of the United Nations, John Paul II enumerated the basic rights of all individuals:

“The right to life, liberty and security of the person; the right to food, clothing, housing, sufficient health care, rest, and leisure; the right to freedom of expression, education and culture; the right to freedom of thought, conscience and religion; the right to manifest one’s religion either individually or in community, in public or in private; the right to choose a state of life, to found a family and to enjoy all conditions necessary for family life; the right to property and work, to adequate working conditions and a just wage; the right of assembly and association; the right to freedom of movement, to internal and external migration; the right to nationality and residence; the right to political participation and the right to participate in the free choice of the political system of the people to which one belongs.”

The effort to insure these rights often leads to conflict – between and within nations. And it often leads to conflict among individuals, especially if “my” perceived right conflict with “your” perceived right. That’s why discussion and, eventual, consensus on the common good is essential in our politics and society. We can sometimes be called to sacrifice our right so that others can enjoy theirs.

**RESPONSIBILITIES**

In his 1963 encyclical Peace on Earth, Pope John XXIII embraced human rights and added the much-needed dimension of responsibilities which help to balance and complement human rights. From that point on, the Church has sought to be a visible and vocal defender of human rights, as a

critical element in the defense and safeguarding of human dignity. Corresponding to rights are duties and responsibilities – to one another, to our families, and to the larger society. Human dignity is respected and the common good is fostered only if human rights are protected and basic responsibilities are met.

**#3—DERECHOS Y RESPONSABILIDADES**

“Cada persona tiene un derecho fundamental para vivir,” Dicen los Obispos de U.S., “El derecho que hace posible a otros derechos. Cada persona también tiene derechos a las condiciones para vivir o decadencia de vida-fe y la vida familiar, alimentos y albergue, educación y empleo, cuidado de salud y hospedaje. Nosotros también tenemos la tarea de asegurar y respetar este derecho no solo para nosotros mismos, pero para otros, y para cumplir nuestras responsabilidades para nuestros familiares, de unos a otros, y para una gran sociedad.” (Fieles Ciudadanos: Un llamado al Católico de responsabilidad Política, 2003.)

Derechos y Responsabilidades son lazos de unión: “La obligación de ganarnos el propio pan presume el derecho de hacerlo.” (Los Cien Años, Centesimus Annus, Juan Pablo II, 1991)

Enfatizando derechos y no cumplir con las responsabilidades conduce a contradicciones y amenaza las buenas intenciones. Muchas de las discusiones en las políticas de hoy se enfocan en derechos individuales, y no cumplen con las responsabi-

lidades correspondientes incluyendo nuestra responsabilidad corporativa, de uno para el otro y de futuras generaciones.

### DERECHOS

Derechos Humanos pueden ser, y con frecuencia son, interpretados muy ampliamente, y son en ocasiones con el deseo de querer confundirlos. En las enseñanzas Católicas Sociales, los derechos relacionados a las necesidades básicas de vida, una vida dignificada es el centro de la ecena.

En su Discurso para la Asamblea General número 34th de las Naciones Unidas, Juan Pablo II enumera los derechos básicos de todo individuo:

“El derecho a la vida, libertad y seguridad de la persona; el derecho a los alimentos, vestimenta, hogar, suficiente cuidado medico, descanso, y relajación; el derecho a la libertad de expresión, educación y cultura; el derecho a la libertad de pensamientos, consciencia y religion; el derecho a manifestar la religion de uno ya sea individual ó en comunidad, en publico o en privado; el derecho para escoger un estado de vida, para formar una familia y disfrutar toda condición necesaria para una vida familiar; el derecho a propiedad y trabajo, a una condición adecuada de trabajo y un salario justo; el derecho a reuniones y asociación; el derecho a la libertad de movimiento, para una interna o externa migracion; el derecho a la recidencia y nacionalidad; el derecho a participa cion politica y el

derecho a participar en la libertad de escoger el sistema politico de la gente a la cual pertenecemos.”

El esfuerzo de asegurar estos derechos con frecuencia nos llevan a conflictos-entre y dentro de las naciones. Y con frecuencia llevan a conflictos entre individuos, especialmente si “mi” derecho percibe y contradice con el “tuyo”. Es por eso que las discusiones y, eventual, consenso sobre las buenas intenciones son esenciales en nuestros politicos y sociedad. Algunas veces nosotros tambien somos llamados a sacrificar nuestro derecho para que otros puedan disfrutar los de ellos.

### RESPONSIBILIDADES

En su enciclical Paz en la Tierra de 1963, el Papa Juan XXIII (23) abarca los derechos humanos y agrega la inmensa-necesidad, dimension de responsabilidades las cuales ayudan para el balance y complementos a derechos humanos. Desde ese punto en adelante, la Iglesia busca ser visible y defensora verval de los derechos humanos, como un elemento critico en defensa y salvaguardia de la dignidad humana. Correspondiendo a los derechos hay deberes y responsabilidades de unos a otros, para nuestras familias, y para las grandes sociedades.

La Dignidad Humana es respetada y la buena intencion formentada sólo si los derechos humanos son protegidos y las responsabilidades básicas se encuentran.
