March 9, 2014 ✦ FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT (A)

In the campus Church where I work, more people show up on Ash Wednesday than on any other day. Practicing Catholics, Catholics who are a little (or a lot) out of practice, and non-Catholics who sense the need for a period of discipline stream through the doors to remember that they are dust and into dust they shall return.

With a cross smudged on their foreheads, they go out, sensing that this defined six-week block we call Lent is a real chance to change course and renew their lives. Many of them return each Sunday to hear ancient stories and try to live into the good intentions symbolized by the ashes.

Ash Wednesday creates a framework for conversion, and the First Sunday of Lent tells us why we need it. The Genesis story is an explanation for the brokenness of the world that comes not from God's error in creation, but from our desire to be God and control our own destiny. The creature cannot be the creator. We cannot know fully what God knows. For Adam and Eve, such knowledge is power, and they aren't content with what God has given them.

In the desert, Jesus is also tempted to show his power and take control from his Father. He could refuse to subject himself to God's will. He could make bread and force God to care for him. Even more, he could give power over to one who is not God.

Instead, Jesus gives his life over to God. With his grace, we can do the same.

Where are *you* being tempted to push God aside and take control?

CALL TO FAMILY, COMMUNITY, AND PARTICIPATION

This theme says that we are to work together to build healthy and caring societies for both personal and public benefit. We (and our governmental representatives) are called to explore the issues of the day – abortion, healthcare, poverty, access to jobs, taxation, the environment, etc. – realizing that in a pluralistic society there will be differences in the objectives and means to achieve them. We are called to discuss and compromise in order that differing ideologies not block the achievement of any real progress in these areas. In fact, the reason that government/political authority exists is to protect human life and human dignity and achieve a common good for all citizens. This is in stark contrast to the extreme individualism and selfish capitalism that we often witness on a daily basis.

Central to the common good is the family. The family is the central social institution that must be supported and strengthened, not undermined. Our family is where we learn to relate with each other, sacrifice for others and, most importantly, love one another. It is also where we develop our sense of participation, justice and other skills important in a well-functioning society. The family is often called the domestic or the first church.

While our society often exalts individualism, the Catholic tradition teaches that human beings grow and

achieve fulfillment in families with a mother and a father and in community. We believe people have a right and a duty to participate in society, seeking together the common good and well-being of all, especially the poor and vulnerable.

When a newborn infant is presented for Baptism by parents and godparents, the water, words, oil, white garment and candle flame surround the new birth of a child of God. Held high for all to see, the infant is welcomed, often with applause, into the Christian community. As the child grows, the wider community invites this developing person to participation within the Church. There can be no doubt; the child is not alone, but called from Baptism onward to be part of a community and to participate in that community. The baptized person is not an onlooker or a spectator; he or she is linked to others in the family, parish, workplace, neighborhood, and global community. Those who think that the baptized merely “Pay, pray, and obey” are mistaken; those who think that church attendance is just an individual “feel good” experience are mistaken.

On the 80th anniversary of *Rerum Novarum*, the first social encyclical, Pope Paul VI wrote, “It is not enough to recall principles, state intentions, point to crying injustices and utter prophetic denunciations; these words will lack real weight unless they are accompanied for each individual by a livelier sense of personal responsibility and by effective action.” (48.1)

Participation in public life is both a moral and ethical obligation.

The challenge for each one of us is to critically listen to the issues of the day and use Catholic social principles as the lens through which we interpret the real issues, their moral implications and potential solutions.

The call to follow Jesus is challenging, but eternally rewarding. It is inextricably bound to the community at every step of the way.

The call is nothing less than the transformation of society....one community, one family, one person at a time.

EL LLAMDO A LA FAMIIA, LA COMUNIDAD Y PARTICIPACIÓN.

Estos temas dicen que debemos trabajar juntos para construir cuidados sanos y saludables para ambos personal y beneficios publicos. Estamos llamados para discutirlo y comprometernos en orden de diferenciar la ideologia, notruncar la realización de ningun progreso real en estas áreas. En realidad, la razón de que el Gobierno/ autoridades politicas existen es para proteger la vida humana y la dignidad humana y lograr un derecho bueno para todos los

ciudadanos. Esto es un completo contraste para el individualismo extremo y el egoísmo del capitalismo del cual constantemente somos testigos diariamente .

Comunmente el centro de todo lo bueno es la Familia. La Familia es el centro Social, la Institución que debe ser apoyada y fortalecida, no subestimada. Nuestra familia es en donde nosotros aprendemos a relacionarnos unos con otros, sacrificarse por otros y, más importante, amarnos los unos a los otros. Esto es también donde nosotros desarrollamos el sentido de participación, justicia y otros talentos importantes como también funcionando en sociedad. La familia es constantemente llamada la familia doméstica o la primera Iglesia.

Mientras nuestra Sociedad exalta constantemente individualismo, la tradición Católica enseña que el ser humano crece y realiza la satisfacción en familias con una mamá y un papá y en una comunidad. Creemos que la gente tiene el derecho y tarea de participar en sociedad, buscando unidos el bienestar común y la seguridad de todos especialmente el pobre y el más vulnerable.

Cuando un infante recién nacido es presentado para el bautismo, por los padres y padrinos, el agua, palabras, aceites, vestimenta blanca, la vela encendida abarca el Nuevo nacimiento de un niño de Dios. Se levanta alto para que todos lo vean, se le da la bienvenida a la comunidad Cristiana, seguido con aplauso.

Mientras el niño crece, la amplia comunidad invita a estas personas desarrollándose para que participen dentro de su iglesia. No puede haber dudas o preocupaciones; El niño no estará solo, pero el llamado de su

bautismo hacia adelante de ser parte de una comunidad y de participar en esa comunidad. La persona bautizada no eso ó será un espectador; él ó ella están conectados a otros en la familia y, parroquias, lugares de trabajo, vecindarios, y comunidad global. Aquellos que piensan que el bautizado simplemente "Paga, resa, y obedece" están equivocados; esos que piensan que la asistencia es solo individual "se sienten bien" su experiencia está equivocada.

En el aniversario número 80th de Rerum Novarum, la primer enciclica social, el Papa Pablo VI escribió, "esto no es necesario para retroceder directores, intenciones de estado, puntos para llorar injusticias y emitir denuncias proféticas; Estas palabras encerrarán un peso real a nos ser que estas sean acompañadas por veracidad de cada individuo, sentido de personal responsable y por una acción efectiva." (48.1)

La participación en la vida Pública es ambas una obligación moral y ética.

El desafío para cada uno de nosotros es de escuchar críticamente los asuntos del día y usar principios sociales Católicos mientras comúnmente a través los cuales nosotros interpretamos los asuntos reales. Simplificación moral, y soluciones potenciales.

El llamado para seguir a Jesús es estimulante, pero eternamente recomenzado. Esta es una unión un acercamiento seguro para la comunidad en cada paso del camino.

Tal llamado es nada menos que la transformación de sociedad....una comunidad, una familia, una persona a la vez.
