What was it like in the years after the crucifixion? What was it like to talk about an experience and a relationship unlike anything ever encountered?

What was it like to go to jail for preaching what you described as Good News even though it seemed foolish to many of the people who were listening?

Paul saw it in terms of a race whose finish line was heaven and for which he was willing to spend his last ounce of energy.

Peter saw that once he acknowledged who Jesus was, he had no choice but to proclaim the truth of his heart. He knew Jesus was the Messiah because he saw it in the look of those who were healed, fed, and restored at Christ's hand.

He experienced it in the love Christ gave him even after he denied him. He saw it in the faces of those he healed in Christ's name and who eagerly came to baptism and the outpouring of the Spirit.

What is it like now? How do we know Jesus is the Messiah in our hearts? And how has that made a

difference in our lives? Is this relationship so unlike any other that we are willing to be poured out, to spend our energy, to proclaim the Good News even though it may seem foolish?

That's an uncomfortable question for many Catholics. For many of us, religion and faith are private matters, and sometimes that helps us avoid

arguments or endless debate. But the compelling story of our redemption begs to be told, if not in words, than in lives transformed.

This is our story and our race to be run—full out to the very last.

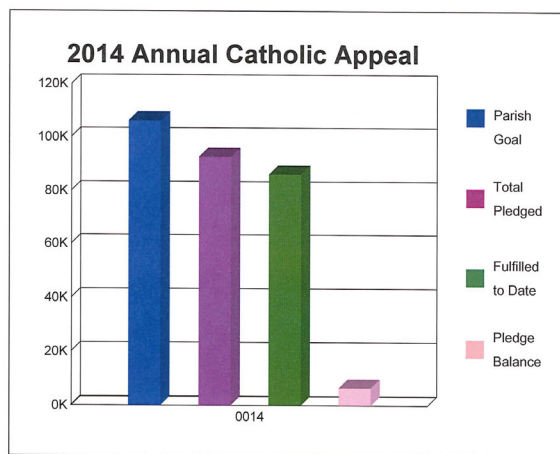

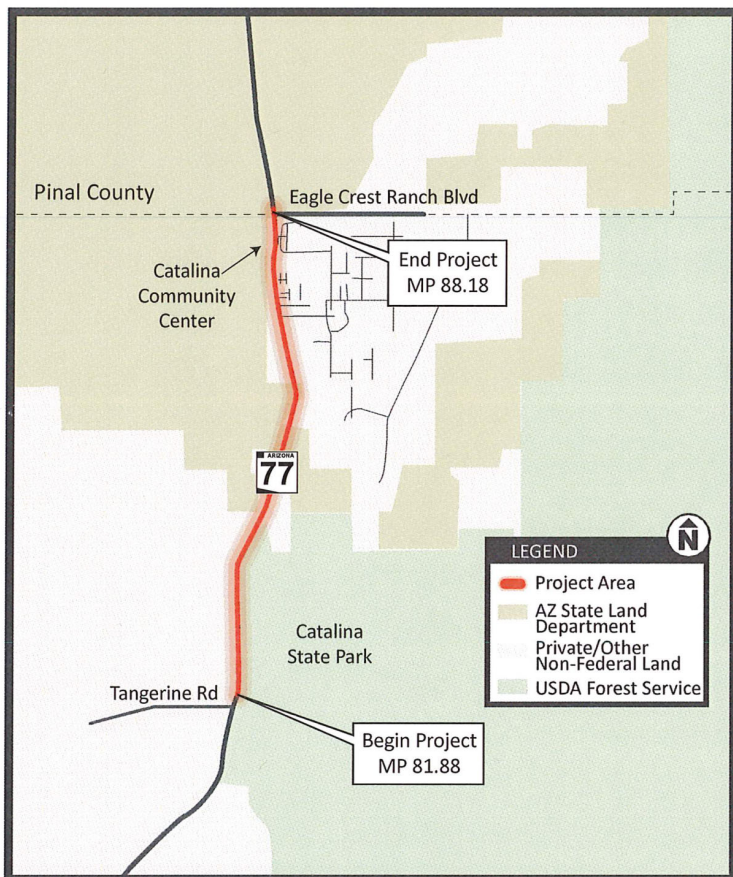




Oracle Road (State Route 77) TANGERINE ROAD TO PINAL COUNTY LINE

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The purpose of this project is to widen the roadway to improve traffic flow and enhance safety on the heavily traveled segment of Oracle Road from Tangerine Road to the Pinal County Line. The widening of Oracle Road from two lanes to three lanes in each direction will tie into the recently widened section of the highway from Calle Concordia to Tangerine Road.



PROPOSED IMPROVEMENTS

- ▶ An additional 12-foot wide travel lane in each direction for a total of six travel lanes throughout the project area
- ▶ 10-foot wide shoulders (7-foot wide with curb in Catalina) allowing cyclists to use widened shoulders
- ▶ Raised-center medians and left-turn lanes in the Catalina area
- ▶ Retaining walls
- ▶ Sound barriers
- ▶ Traffic signal improvements
- ▶ Drainage improvements
- ▶ Shared-use path on the east side of Oracle Road from Wilds Road to Eagle Crest Ranch Boulevard
- ▶ Two wildlife crossing structures to allow wildlife to migrate safely between the Santa Catalina and Tortolita mountains, without crossing the roadway at street level. The crossing structures are made possible through the RTA and are planned to coincide with the ADOT widening project for Oracle Road.

PROJECT TIMELINE

Roadway Construction will begin in Summer 2014. It is anticipated that the work will be completed by Spring 2016.

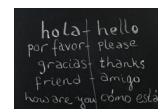
Are you interested in a Bible study for the Sunday readings?

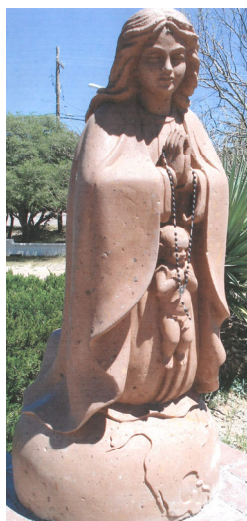
SPANISH CLASS

ON A MISSION

In many ways the two saints we celebrate today could not have been more different—Peter, a village fisherman of headstrong character, an emotional nature, and an impulsive streak; Paul, educated by rabbis in Jerusalem, a skilled tentmaker by trade, and a Roman citizen. Both met Jesus—Peter in person and Paul in a vision—and both were changed forever. Each had a dark side to his nature. Before his conversion, Paul believed disciples of Jesus were a threat to Judaism and was willing to kill them to protect the religion he held dear. Peter was a follower of Jesus for three years, yet he allowed fear to overtake him on Good Friday and denied his Lord three times. Even so, both came to recognize that the risen Jesus was indeed the Messiah, the anointed one of God. Peter was told by the Lord to feed his lambs and sheep (the new believers) while Paul was inspired to take the gospel into the non-Jewish world. Such was their conviction in Jesus that they suffered everything along the way from verbal attacks to flogging, imprisonment, and shipwreck. Not once were they deterred from spreading the Good News that neither sin nor physical death is the end for us. In their own ways, using their heroic virtues, each fulfilled his mission and went to a martyr's death. We have a Savior who knows all our trials and offers us a way to follow him into eternal life. We too are given a mission. At the end of every Mass we are told to "Go in peace to love and serve the Lord." This is not just a pious way of saying, "Have a nice day!" The whole intent is to remind us that we have a daily mission of our own. What's yours?

How do I choose a Bible?

I went online to buy a Bible and was immediately overwhelmed by the number available. How do I choose one?

Every family should have a printed Bible—not just a nice book to put on the coffee table, but one they actually pick up and read.

The most obvious way to spot a Catholic translation is that "Catholic Edition" is printed on the cover, but you can also tell by the imprimatur on the copyright page and the presence of the deuterocanonical books of the Bible—1 and 2 Maccabees, Tobit, Judith, Sirach, Wisdom of Solomon, Baruch, and additional parts of Daniel and Esther—which aren't found in Protestant versions of the Bible. Some call these books the *apocrypha*, which means "hidden," a term often used to refer to noninspired books.

Even though several Protestant versions of the Bible are very good, from a Catholic standpoint they're incomplete.

Several Catholic translations are available, but the version used at Mass—the one you're probably most familiar with—is the *New American Bible*, revised edition, published by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. A free online version is available on the USCCB website (usccb.org/bible/). The online version is helpful when you can remember a verse but not where to find it. The website also has daily readings, podcasts, and other features that will help you move closer to God through Scripture.
