Progress Isn't Always Easy

Jesus' miracles and preaching were part of what convinced people that he was the Son of God. He spoke like no other and then backed up his words with amazing and wonderful actions. For example, he confronted evil spirits and cast them out. The people were amazed and saw this as evidence of his divinity, because no one had absolute power over evil—except God himself. This is a power the Church continues to practice today through the ministry of healing and exorcism.

Jesus did not want to see people suffer under the power of Satan but rather wanted them to live full and happy lives. "I came that they might have life and have it abundantly," Jesus said in John 10:10. This strong desire of Jesus to heal and save drove him to tirelessly preach and do good. And because of this combination of goodness and power in his person, his fame spread. Yet the message he preached was challenging and demanding. Eventually many preferred to silence that good, powerful, but demanding voice.

Today, like Jesus, the Church still longs for nothing less than humanity's complete health and happiness. Yet, at times, the path to that human progress is not the easiest. Like temperamental children are chided by loving parents to eat healthy food rather than just what they like, so the good and powerful voice and

Notes from Fr. Larry

It is Flu Season —

I realize I don't need to point out that a lot of people have been getting the flu and bad colds lately but I need to reiterate the fact that if you are sick you are excused from Mass. If you feel you are coming down with a cold or just getting over it, it may be better to stay home and get completely well. I know we will miss you and you will miss being with your parish community, but please don't share your sickness. This may seem a little harsh, but a good number of our parishioners have a weakened immune system due to age and colds and flu spread easily.

It has been suggested that we cancel the wine at Mass. I would prefer not to do that, but encourage people not to receive if they even think they may be sick. When we receive the host we are receiving the totality of Jesus, the cup makes it a fuller experience but is not necessary. The opposite is also true; you can receive from the cup without receiving the host. I will leave it up to the individual to decide if they wish to receive from the cup.

Another suggestion is to have hand sanitizers around the church and tell people not to shake hands during the sign of peace. I will put bottles of hand sanitizer by the doors for people as they come into church, but realize that although it may help, nothing will keep all the germs away.

In regards to the sign of peace, if someone does not want to shake your hand, don't take it personally, maybe they are not feeling well and are being kind by not infecting you.

Remember, if you are sick you don't need to come to Mass, it is not a sin, just spend some time praying for the health of other members of the parish, and pray for your own healing.

Notas del Padre Larry

Es Temporada de Gripe-Resfriados —

No es necesario señalar que mucha gente ha estado resfriada ó resfriado últimamente, pero tendré que reiterar el hecho de que si está enfermo, se le dispensa la Misa. Si sienten que están cayendo con un resfriado ó simplemente se está recuperando de uno, sería mejor que se quedara en casa y así, recuperarse completamente. Sepa que lo extrañaremos y usted extrañará estar con su comunidad parroquial, pero por favor no comparta su enfermedad. Esto tal vez pueda parecerle un poco duro, pero un buen número de nuestros filigreses padecen de un Sistema Inmune debilitado debido a la edad, a los resfriados y la gripe que se propagan fácilmente.

Se ha sugerido que se cancele el vino en la Misa. Preferiría no hacer eso, pero alertamos a las personas que no deben recibir si creen que están enfermas. Cuando recibimos la hostia, estamos recibiendo totalmente a Jesús, el cáliz lo hace una experiencia más completa, pero no es necesario. Lo opuesto también es cierto; puedes recibir de la copa sin recibir la hostia. Yo le de jo eso al individuo para que desida si desea recibir de la copa.

Otra sugerencia es tener desinfectantes de manos alrededor de la Iglesia y anunciar a la gente para que no se saluden de mano en el signo de la paz. Se pondrán botellas de desinfectantes para las manos a la entrada de la Iglesia que la gente podrá usar en cuanto entren a la Iglesia, pero se darán cuenta de que, aunque puede ayudar, nada evitará de que no se queden todos los germenos. Con respecto al signo de la paz, si alguien no quiere estrechar tu mano, no se lo tome como algo personal, tal vez no se sienta bien y esté siendo amable al no querer infectarlo.

Recuerde, que si está enfermo no necesita venir a Misa, no será un pecado, sólo pase un tiempo en oración por los otros miembros de la parroquia y también ore por su propia sanación.

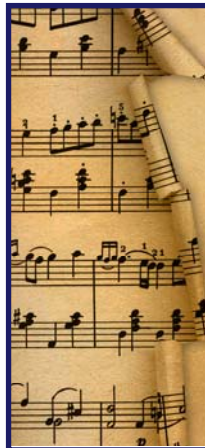

XLT STANDS FOR "EXALT"

The word *exalt* means to hold someone or something in very high regard. As Roman Catholics, we hold the Eucharist in the highest regards. We believe that the bread and wine become the actual body and blood of Jesus Christ. According to the teachings of the Roman Catholic Church, the change of substance or essence by which the bread and wine offered in the sacrifice of the sacrament of the Eucharist during the Mass, become, in reality, the body and blood of Jesus Christ. The conversion of the substance of the Eucharistic elements into the body and blood of Christ at consecration is what Catholics call Transubstantiation (tran-sub-stan-ti-a-tion), only the appearance of bread and wine remain.

We believe that this is what Jesus was telling us in the holy scripture passages of Matthew 26:26-30, Luke 22:14-23, 1 Corinthians 11: 24-25, and in John 6:32-58.



In addition to receiving Jesus in the holy Eucharist, we can also place ourselves in the presence of our Beloved Savior, in the form of Eucharistic Adoration. Adoration is a practice in which the Blessed Sacrament is adored by the faithful. From a theological perspective, the adoration is a form of latria (supreme worship allowed for God only), based on the tenet (a religious principle or belief) of the real presence of Christ in the Blessed Host.

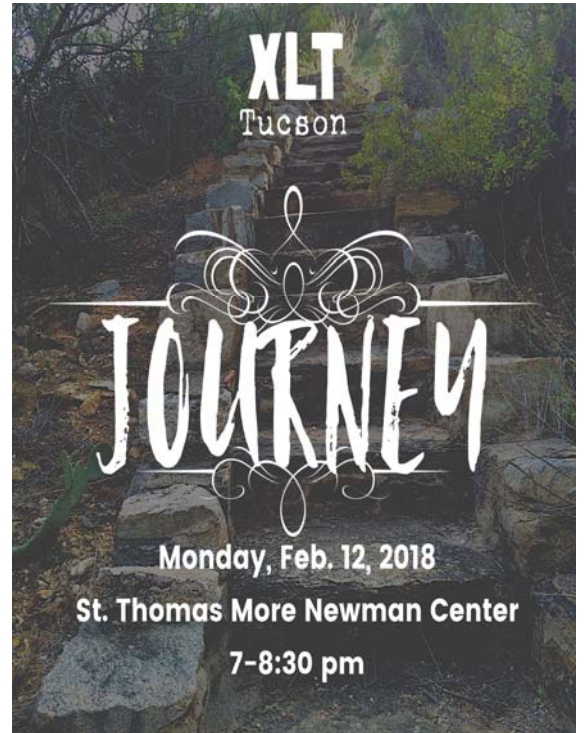
Placing ourselves in the presence of our Savior is truly a blessed time. It is a peaceful and relaxing feeling. One, which we seldom experience in this world that is filled with so many distractions. It is being silent and shutting everything out.

"Thanks for the love, care, time and gifts. We appreciate it very much. May God and all the angels be with you on the holiday."

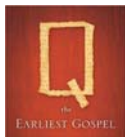
"Thank you for bringing us cookies and presents. We appreciate you guys because if it wasn't for you guys we wouldn't have had nothing."

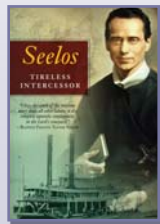

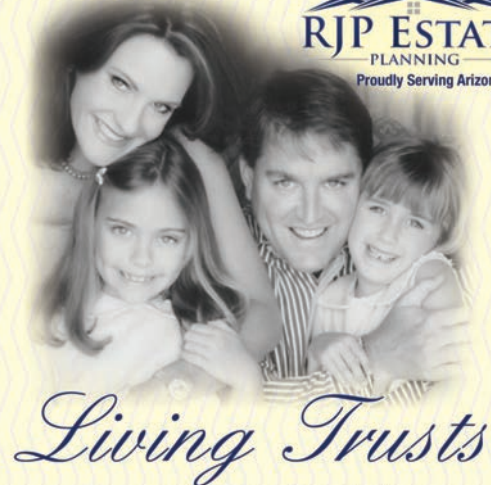
