



Remembrance Mass for Those Who Have Died by Suicide Tuesday, Sept. 10th at noon



any questions, please contact the Parish Office.


Don't Forget the Sassy Solos Meeting

How the Rosary Became a Torch of Hope

While Saint Dominic of Guzman is well known as the founder of the Dominicans, he is also known as Our Lady's first Rosary Champion. History tells that before he was born in the twelfth century in Spain, his mother, Blessed Jane of Aza, had a dream in which she saw a hound leaping from her womb with a torch in his mouth. In her own words, she said, "The animal seemed to set the earth on fire!"

Saint Dominic became a priest in 1194, and by 1214 had already been posted to the city of Toulouse in France, which was being plagued by the Albigensian heresy and overall moral corruption. Saint Dominic set about preaching and trying to convert the people back to God. However, his preaching met with little success until the day when, after having spent days praying, fasting and doing severe penances, Our Lady appeared to him as a mother bringing her child hope.

"Dear Dominic", she said lovingly, "Do you know which weapon the Blessed Trinity uses to reform the world?" Dominic cried out to her that he was at a loss. She replied, "In this kind of warfare, the battering ram has always been the Angelic Psalter." She then instructed the saint on how she wished

the Angelic Psalter to be prayed. It was thereafter that Saint Dominic began to preach what we now know as the "Rosary".

In subsequent centuries until today, devotees understand that the enormous power attributed to this beautiful Marian devotion comes from the structure of the Rosary, in which devotees meditate on the mysteries of our salvation, the Incarnation, the Redemption and eternal, interlaced with the Lord's prayer and the Angelic salutation (the Hail Mary).

Since the day Our Lady gave the Rosary to Saint Dominic, Divine Providence has provided a saint in every century through whom the devotion to the Rosary has been rekindled, reminding humanity of the power of the Rosary and how it has brought untold spiritual hope, growth, conversion, protection and a good death to all who pray it consistently and with devotion.

Our Lady of the Rosary, pray for us who have recourse to thee!

Gospel Reflection - 21st Sunday in Ordinary Time

The famous Russian novelist Fyodor Dostoyevsky said, "Love in action is a harsh and dreadful thing." In the Gospel reading this week, Jesus does something harsh and dreadful — he watches his own disciples abandon him. What could possibly be loving about that?

Well, we notice the context is Jesus' teaching about eating and drinking his body and blood. His followers hear this and say,


"This teaching is difficult; who can accept it?" (John 6:60). We shouldn't imagine we'd do anything different, because not even the ones who stay, like Peter, seem to understand what Jesus is saying. Then we hear this devastating line, "Because of this many of his disciples turned back and no longer went

about with him" (John 6:66). Besides the night of the Last Supper, only now do Jesus' disciples abandon him. And, painfully, Jesus just lets them go.

The best way to make sense out of this is love. Jesus is God's love in action. He wants to become one with those whom He loves. He wants to love them as His own body. Yes, the oneness manifested in the Eucharist sounds harsh and dreadful because it is

rooted in love which is willing to risk abandonment and separation to attain its goal: to be one body with the beloved. It is both terrifying and wonderful that Jesus will risk losing us in order to be one with us. Our response? Lord, we cannot grasp a love so great, but please help us never to abandon it, either.

Reflexión del Evangelio - XXI Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Algunos de los seguidores de Jesús no pudieron creer lo que les dijo. Era demasiado para ellos: "Mi carne es verdadera comida y mi sangre es verdadera bebida" (Juan 6:55). A pesar de que Jesús lo explicaba de muchas maneras, algunos decidieron abandonarlo. Él no hizo nada por detenerlos, los dejó libres respetando su decisión. Después de esos acontecimientos de abandono, Jesús pregunta directamente a los doce: "¿Quieren marcharse también ustedes? Pedro le contestó: Señor, ¿a quién iríamos? Tú tienes palabras de vida eterna. Nosotros creemos y sabemos que tú eres el Santo de Dios" (Juan 6:67-69). Ahora, en la realidad que vivimos tan llena de ruido y modernidad, ¿sabemos a dónde vamos, a quién dirigirnos? Pedro, lo supo y

el deseo de la Iglesia es que sepamos que solo Jesús tiene palabras de vida eterna. Y que su Pan de Vida se nos da gratuitamente en la Eucaristía.

"La Eucaristía y la cruz son piedras de tropiezo. Es el mismo misterio, y no cesa de ser ocasión de división. ¿Quieren marcharse también ustedes? (Juan 6:67): esta pregunta del Señor resuena a través de las edades, como invitación de su amor a descubrir que sólo Él tiene palabras de vida eterna (Juan 6:68), y que acoger en la fe el don de su Eucaristía es acogerlo a Él mismo". Novena for the Nov 5th National Election

Santa Catalina's Pastoral Council has prepared and recommends to all parishioners and ministries the following Novena as spiritual preparation for the November 5 National Election.

Novena 5 Intention:

Pray for Justice and Reform in our Nation and our Church and for Peace and protection of Life in our World.

"O God, grant that we who call on you in our need, as we exercise our right and duty to vote, may discern what is right, and with your guidance, do it.

God, Holy Spirit, light up our minds with the fire of your Divine Love, Grant us your gifts of Wisdom, Council and Knowledge as we

discern our choices in praying and voting for Justice, Reform, Peace and Life. Send forth your Spirit and renew the face of the earth."

In addition, Pray one decade of the Rosary, The Descent of the Holy Spirit, or the Chaplet of Divine Mercy.

We recommend beginning the Novena Prayer in August and repeating the Novenas (9 days) several times leading up to November 5.

To Whom Shall We Go?

A friend of mine, who is a far better Christian than I can ever hope to be, once shared with me that her family sneers at her belief system and lifestyle.

She believes in fairy tales they tell her. She's looking for simple solutions from a kind-faced man in the sky because she doesn't want to grapple with complicated answers to complicated problems.

Religion, they argue, is the easy way out.

As she spoke about this, her voice became unsteady. Not with anger, but with emotion. "I would never call this life easy," she said. "If I was looking for something that was easy, I wouldn't choose Catholicism."

What was unspoken was *why* she has chosen Catholicism. I know the answer, but only because I know her. I knew her before she chose it wholeheartedly, and I know her now, and I see the difference. I see that these words are written so clearly across the days of her life: "Master, to whom shall we go?"

Once the truth is known in your soul, you see, it can never be unknown.

Following Christ is not about easy answers and simple teachings. Sure, it all sounds very basic: love one

another as I have loved you. What could be more straightforward?

But what does that mean? What does that look like in daily, modern life, in a world full of the fallen, whose flaws have given us rough edges and weakened wills?


I'll tell you what it looks like — it looks like a struggle. It looks like failure and mess and confusion and losing your way and finding it again, all because you remembered that within you there is a compass pointing due north. It's a constant state of wandering in the dark, following a Voice that asks you to go where you're afraid to go. And you follow the Voice not because it's the only voice there is and not because it's the voice that says what you want to hear, but because it's the only one that speaks the truth, and the truth pulls on you in a way you can't quite resist.

When Christ asks, "Do you also want to leave?" he is not gaslighting us. It's a genuine question. We are free to go. We are not prisoners.

But we have heard the words of everlasting life, and now we can only have peace if we follow where they lead

Outreach

En el pasado, los miembros de nuestro Ministerio de la Dignidad por la Vida Humana han hablado desde el púlpito sobre la campaña de recolección de de los tres niños que firmas a favor del aborto. También hemos publicado artículos informativos en boletines sobre este importante tema. El objetivo de la campaña de recolección de firmas del grupo "Arizona for Abortion Access" era conseguir que se incluyera en la papeleta electoral una enmienda constitucional que consagrará el aborto sin restricciones en Arizona. Desafortunadamente, como resultado de su esfuerzo de recolección de firmas a favor del aborto, la enmienda propuesta podría estar en la papeleta electoral este noviembre; se está esperando por la verificación de las firmas.

Citando el derecho al aborto, el Artículo 11 de la Constitución de Arizona será enmendado agregando la Sección 8.1. Que leería, ""...que debe haber "un interés estatal imperioso para denegar, restringir o interferir con un aborto" y que el estado no puede "infringir la toma de decisiones autónomas de un individuo" para abortar." Esta enmienda permite una "autonomía absoluta" para que una mujer tome la decisión de abortar. Lo que esa "autonomía absoluta" no dice es "haz lo que quieras siempre y cuando no lastime a nadie". Lamentablemente, "autonomía absoluta" significa "haz lo que quieras". De ello se desprende que la "autonomía absoluta" para elegir un aborto, tiene muchas víctimas.

Ley De Acceso Al Aborto De Arizona

Las familias son las víctimas. La hermana Lucía dos Santos, uno presenciaron las apariciones de la Santísima Virgen en Fátima, dijo que "la batalla



final entre el Señor y Satanás será sobre la familia". La enmienda sobre el aborto elimina la notificación a los padres, con lo que los excluye, a pesar de que siempre hemos sido una cultura orientada a la familia.

Las mujeres y las niñas menores de edad son las víctimas. La Santa Madre Teresa afirmó: "Las mujeres y las niñas sufren complicaciones inmediatas y posiblemente mortales después de los abortos". Además, y esto es muy preocupante, las mujeres y las niñas son vulnerables a la coerción, la explotación y la trata de personas.

Los bebés son las primeras víctimas sin voz. Es el corazón del bebé el que se detiene con el aborto. La Santa Madre Teresa afirmó: "Es una pobreza decidir que un bebé debe morir para que tú puedas vivir como deseas".

Nuestra sociedad también es víctima. La vida es nuestro primer derecho. Sin vida, ningún otro derecho merece ser defendido. El derecho inalienable afirmado por la Declaración de Independencia es el derecho a la vida, ya sea joven o viejo, débil o fuerte, sano o discapacitado.

incorporating spirituality. On October 4, 2023, the feast of St. Francis of Assisi, Pope Francis published his second document Laudate Deum, meaning 'Praise God'. 
