

Stay Safe: Protect Yourself from Phishing Emails

Dear Santa Catalina Parish Family,

As we continue to grow in faith and community, your safety, both spiritual and digital, is important to me. Here are some tips to help you stay protected from phishing scams. At Santa Catalina, we use two email platforms to stay in touch:

Official Parish Emails: Always come from @santacatalinaparish.org (e.g., name@santacatalinaparish.org)

Flocknote

1. Look for the sheep icon in the subject line



 Verify the sender's information at the end of the message, which usually appears as "Sent by Fr. Huy Vu, C.S.s.R, date & time"

Important Reminders:

Santa Catalina will never ask for sensitive information, such as passwords, credit card numbers, social security numbers, or request gift cards from you over email.

If you're unsure about an email's legitimacy, always err on the side of caution. Report suspicious emails to communication@santacatalinaparish.org. Call Donna at the parish office **520-825-9611** to verify the legitimacy of the email or request.

To help keep our parish family informed, I've included a short <u>training video</u> on identifying and avoiding phishing scams. This short video provides valuable insights into phishing scams and how to protect yourself:

Phishing Emails Scam Training Video Key takeaways:

 Phishing emails don't always contain suspicious links but can still be harmful such as asking you to provide personal information directly in the email.



- 2. Scammers often use deceptive subject lines and email addresses
- 3. Legitimate organizations will not ask for sensitive info via email
- 4. Not all websites can be trusted, even if they appear in internet search results
- 5. Be cautious of emails that:
 - Create a sense of urgency
 - Contain misspellings or grammatical errors
 - Ask for personal or financial information

Stay safe online by:

- 1. Verifying sender identities
- 2. Being wary of generic greetings
- 3. Watching for inconsistent or suspicious language
- 4. Avoiding interactions with suspicious emails

Please take a moment to review these tips and share them with your loved ones. Thank you for your vigilance in protecting not only yourselves but also our Santa Catalina Parish family. Together, we can maintain a safe and connected community both online and in spirit. May God bless and protect us as we enter this busy holiday season.

First Commandment

- Blamed God for my failings?

Remember to keep holy the Sabbath day. Have 1...

- Ensured that my children still under my care regularly frequent the sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion?
- Lived in humble obedience to those who legitimately exercise authority over me?

Local Immersion Tour Shows Parishioners Ways to Help the Poor

Deacon Steve Letourneux, his wife Claire and Carol Smith joined me for SCCC's November Local Immersion to see the poorest of the poor, and to see those who are putting love into action, right here at home. During our visit to Casa Maria, we had the opportunity to speak at length with a volunteer who for 13 years has been going to estate sales every weekend to gather clothing for the poor and homeless. We also had a chance to meet Brian Flagg, who has led Casa Maria for over 40 years. Each day, along with a core team and volunteers, 450 breakfast and lunches are provided to the homeless, and groceries to 150 poor families. We then visited Sister Jose Women's Center (SJWC), where we had the opportunity to have Jean Fedigan (the founder) share with us the plight of homeless women, as well as to show us how faith and love, make a difference. SJWC volunteers provide breakfast, and lunch to about 120 women each day. These women can also access many services, such as laundry and shower facilities. The shelter provides overnight beds to

about 55 women. Both of these organizations, in very different ways, are also trying to stem the increase of the homeless and poor in our neighborhoods. If you want to see how you can make a difference, join me at a future Local Immersion. The next tours are December 20th, January 15th and January 17th.

- Dish Soap / Dishwashing detergent is very expensive and is always appreciated.
