

# Depression is not a normal part of the aging process

Everyone feels sad or "blue" from time to time. But growing older involves adjusting to life changes that often involve loss: of loved ones, of familiar routines, of physical health. Depression is the most common emotional disorder in older adults, occurring in one in seven people over 65. The



symptoms can be overlooked and untreated when they coincide with other medical illness and life events.

Clinical depression is not a moral or spiritual failure. It is a serious medical illness that should be treated at any age. The good news is that clinical depression is one of the most treatable of all mental illnesses. Many older adults do not see

depression as a health issue and feel like they can "handle it themselves." The result is that clinical depression is often not diagnosed which dramatically affects a person's quality of life.

Older adults with depression may not always display classic signs of depression but instead may show signs of dementia, complain of bodily aches and pains, or feel agitated, anxious, or irritable. Because many symptoms of depression are seen as part of other ailments or ignored altogether, an assessment by an informed mental health professional is essential.

# **Coming Soon - Using Colored Pencils**

In August, September, and October, the Arts and Crafts group will focus on creating pictures using colored pencils. Two of our members, Linda Lambert and Carol Quarton, have completed workshops focusing on this media and will share their knowledge with us.

Instructors request participants provide a set of colored pencils (Faber-Castell or Prismacolor [24 or more]), a good eraser, and a pencil sharpener. Various types of paper will be supplied for the first class; participants will need to bring their own paper for future sessions (Strathmore 300 Series Bristol [smooth or vellum] or Strathmore 400 Series Toned Gray Sketch Paper [9 x 12"]) for other sessions.

At the first session, participants will focus on fundamentals, have a few simple blending and shading exercises and then create a 5 x 7" bluebird picture. For future sessions, participants will each work on a personally selected photo(s) or drawing(s) they will bring. Images from participants' chosen photo (s) or drawing (s) can be "free drawn" or traced (using the graphite method or tracing paper) on colored pencil paper.

Throughout sessions, optional tools will be introduced (e.g., blenders, white gel pens, burnishing tools, etc.). The instructors will share examples showing results achieved by using these tools.

## This Week's Gospel Meditation

Note: Due to our special celebration this Sunday of the Redemptorist's Feast Day, the scheduled gospel (Mk 6:30-34) for 16<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time will not be read. Here is Fr. Muir's reflection of Mark's Gospel.


Burnout. Recent studies suggest that roughly twothirds of doctors and nurses have signs of it. You probably know what burnout is: long-term stress leading to emotional exhaustion and a lack of a sense of personal accomplishment. Burnout can threaten anyone who tries to seriously serve and love others. How does our faith inform this challenging experience, and how do we find refreshment?

The apostles face something like burnout this week in Mark 6. They are run down from their missionary work, and Jesus says, "Come away by yourselves to a lonely place, and rest a while." For them, and for us, it takes humility to intentionally rest. It means the world can go on without us. It stings our pride to admit God is necessary and we are not. Choosing to leave our

good work to be with him — whatever the cost is an act of humble faith. And that trust in God begins to revive us.

But there's more to it. Hilariously, Mark tells us that throngs of needy people find out where the

apostles are going and arrive ahead of them. Imagine the exasperation of the burnt-out apostles. "Can we please get a minute to ourselves? This is not healthy!" And Jesus seems to encourage the boundary violation by telling his frayed

followers to feed the crowd. Look: once we move into humble rest, he calls us to more work, because we are made for love, not for rest. But Jesus does the vast bulk of the labor. He himself is the one who multiplies the small offering until everyone is satisfied.

What finally gives our heart rest isn't more vacation time. It's experiencing the super abundant generosity of God for us and those whom we serve.

### Feast of the Most Holy Redeemer - Fr. Huy Vu

The Redemptorists have celebrated the Solemnity of the Most Holy

Redeemer on this third Sunday of July since 1749. Though not a public liturgical feast, it is an essential day for Redemptorists worldwide. The feast is vital for us because the official name of the Redemptorists is Congregation of The Most Holy Redeemer. St. Alphonsus founded our congregation near Naples in 1732 with the mission "to follow the example of Jesus Christ, the Redeemer." Our purpose is to go out to all people, especially the poor and most abandoned, to share the Good News of Jesus, to bring the joy of the Gospel to everyone we meet, and to tell them about the wonder of being redeemed.

Jesus, the Son of God, born of the Virgin Mary, transformed all that was human within Him and others. He calls each of us to turn from our habits of sin and change into the true gift of our creation. Jesus, from the Cross, reminds us that hope shines brightest when we seek and offer forgiveness. Christ is our hope!

Christ is the ultimate source of our salvation, fully

realized through the Paschal Mystery - God's plan of salvation is fulfilled through four events in Christ's life: His Passion (suffering and crucifixion), Death, Resurrection, and Ascension.



Jesus, the Redeemer of the world, gives us Himself in the Eucharist so that we are set free and restored as children of God.

Through this mystery of Redemption, may we open our hearts to Jesus and receive the gift of His presence in the Eucharist. Let us seek His wisdom to bring reconciliation to those needing healing. As a Redemptorist parish, we are committed to being mission, that is, to be *sent* - just like Jesus. Everything about us is meant to reflect that the way we live, pray, joy in us, and how our church community worships together around the person of lesus, The Redeemer.

Are we ready to embrace our Cross and commit our lives to being Christ's voice, hands, and spirit to bring Hope to the hopeless? Are you willing to go?

#### Santa Angela of Foligno - Saint of the Week

Some saints show marks of holiness very early. Not Angela! Born of a leading family in Foligno, Italy, she became immersed in the quest for wealth and social position. As a wife and mother, she continued this life of distraction.

Around the age of 40, she recognized the emptiness of her life and sought God's help in the Sacrament of Penance. Her Franciscan confessor helped

Angela to seek God's pardon for her previous life and to dedicate herself to prayer and the works of charity.

Shortly after her conversion, her husband and children died. Selling most of her possessions, she entered the Secular Franciscan Order. She was alternately absorbed by meditating on the crucified Christ Angela the title "Teacher of and by serving the poor of Foligno as a nurse and beggar for

their needs. Other women joined her in a religious community.

At her confessor's advice, Angela wrote her Book of Visions and Instructions. In it she recalls some of the temptations she suffered after her conversion: she also expresses her thanks to God for the Incarnation of Jesus. This book and her life earned for Theologians." She was beatified in 1693, and canonized in 2013.

### **Recognize God in Your Ordinary Moments**

#### A Deserted Place

In one of my favorite shows, "Parks and Recreation," there is a scene where one of the characters, Jerry, is tasked with stuffing hundreds of envelopes with flyers as part of his volunteer work for a local city council campaign.

Jerry's efficient, almost mechanical completion of the job amazes his coworkers, who gather to watch in awe while he folds, inserts, seals, and stamps over and over again. After several hours, the huge pile of envelopes is finally ready for mailing ... and Jerry realizes that he has stuffed them all with the wrong piece of paper.

"I always say, it ain't government work unless you do it twice," he quips as he restarts the task.

In any work, no matter how worthy or fulfilling it is, there is a point where the task transforms into mere routine. It can happen with anything: ministry, marriage, parenthood, even prayer. There is no shame in this. It doesn't mean that we don't enjoy these pursuits or feel passion for the mission inherent in them.

It only means that we are human, and we get tired.

When the Apostles return from their travels, Jesus recognizes their exhaustion. He encourages them to "come away to a deserted place." He inhabits a human body, so he knows the weariness to which it is subject. He knows what it is to be tired, to be hungry. He knows that it's hard to do the work when your body is failing you.

It's important for us to recognize those times when Jesus is calling us to a deserted place — and it's important for us to follow him there, even if we are pursued by feelings of doubt and guilt, just as the Apostles were followed by crowds hungry for their ministry.

Solitude is not selfishness. Contemplation is not idleness. To withdraw does not mean to run away.

The work we do — whatever it is — deserves our whole strength. If we have lost that, there is only one place we are sure to find it again.

"He said to them, 'Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." — Mark 6:31

**Question:** What can I do to help our family practice our faith each day?

Answer: Some families practice their religion together as just another event on their schedule: go to church, observe Lent, help at the parish picnic, go to a meeting, volunteer time, make your confession, use your envelope... But the focus needs to be on who we are—God's people, in relationship with him, loved, forgiven, and redeemed, and called to live and proclaim the Gospel. Our awareness of God's presence and our sense of mission are supported by the daily rituals, celebrations, and traditions that help us stay focused. Sharing our faith strengthens us and clarifies the beliefs and values of Christian living.

Daily family practices include time for prayer—before meals, before bed, before important meetings and activities. Attend Sunday Mass together and discuss the homily afterward. Create family celebrations for holy days and holidays. Make religion a regular part of your discussions. Include others, especially the elderly and the less fortunate, in your activities and charitable efforts. By applying the virtues of faith, hope, and love to each day, faith becomes part of who your family is. It influences how you act towards others, what you value, and how mindful of God you are. Faith is the leaven of life that helps all of us rise to our calling and dignity as God's people. ©LPi
